## REMARKABLE COINCIDENCE.

A contributor to Modern Society relates a somewhat remarkable story about the Russian battleship, the Imperator Alexander III. He says it is now six years since it was launched, with impressive ceremonies.

Something unusual took place during the day. It was midsummer, and sunshine flooded the palace and the gardens, as the procession left for the dockyards. By the time everything was ready for the launching, ragged clouds swept up into the sky, and ominous gloom played on their inky fringes. The court chaplains prayed their prayers; incense was swung, and "holy" water sprinkled; the cord, wreathed with roses, which held the lever in place was severed by the stroke of a golden axe, and the huge vessel began to glide slowly down the ways.

Then the storm broke. An awful peal of thunder crashed overhead. A flash of lightning, blue and vivid, came hurtling through the air. The ship was struck. A spar fell, hurtling upon a group of officers standing just behind the czar. Three were killed outright and eight others were wounded. The bystanders fled shrinking across the deck.

The czarina stood, white as death, holding tightly her little girls, Olga and Tatiana, as though to shield the children. The emperor himself was calm and collected. The Empress Dowager could scarcely be comforted. She was convinced that the thunder storm and its fatal flash was the omens of ill for the ship.

It is claimed that Father John of Cronstadt, whom the Russians recognize as a saint, was sent for, and that he uttered this prediction:

"The ship will go down in its first engagement, and I counted three years for each of the men killed three years from that day would see the end of the Romanoffs."

Assuming that this prophecy was actually uttered, the first part has been fulfilled, and the latter part looks very much like it was about to come true. The battleship in question was the first of the ill-fated Potemkin's line, and was almost the first to fall a prey to the guns of the Japanese. Most certainly when that news reached Tsarskoe Selo it would rouse in the minds of the royal family echoes of that awful lightning flash and the prophecy of Father John, presuming the story is true. It must have reminded them of the probability of a literal fulfillment of the other part of the prophecy, which gives the Romanoffs three more years to rule in Russia.

The present conditions of the internal affairs of the empire certainly point to an imminent clash over the ship of state. The clouds are darkening. Beyond the Caucasus, Armenia, Kurds and Tatars are in insurrection and the Cossack garrisons are unable to stop the massacres. In Poland the whole population seems ripe for violence and bloodshed. Following riots and bomb throwing in Warsaw comes a general uprising in Lodz against the authorities. Two thousand victims make one day's work for the mob and the Cossacks.

Rebellion is spreading to the navy, and the army. No government can long exist under such conditions. Defeat headed on defeat in the east and the hatred of a whole people smarting under innumerable wrongs and filled with aspirations for liberty—such is the present condition.

The story of the ominous thunderbolt that interrupted the launching of the Russian battleship reminds us of the eclipse of the sun on Oct. 29, 1882, the four hundredth anniversary of the landing of Columbus in this "New World." It was a gala day at the world's fair. The country was gaily decked in bunting. Music filled the air, miles of humanity partook in the parade, when, behold! the sun was darkened. It was an eclipse, "without scientific importance," the astronomers said. But there was at least one observer in the land who endeavored to interpret the occurrence as a "sign." We refer to Lieutenant Totten, who in an interview with a representative of the Associated Press, a few days later, said, in part:

'Where were our Augurs then? And where had Daniel been had such a thing broken the plains of Shushan at a festival like that? Think you for one moment that Heaven, which hath recorded the number of your very hairs,

was ignorant of that eclipse? If so ye do deceive yourselves, for in the very nature of things there can be no accidents, and certainly none like that.'

"Behold you, too, how such a sign in the skies upon such a day, must have secretly struck the representatives of nine out of every ten of the nations who were gathered to the celebration. For most of them are modern and broadened in our own presumptive way, and all of them believe, as did Nebuchadnezzar of old, that the Kingdom is God's, 'whose ways are judgment, and those who walk in pride He is able to abase.'

"The fact is, there is sin within the door of the National Temple, and it adds but new injury to the trespass to belittle the facts! We cannot be living up to the spirit of the Constitution inherited from our forefathers, and it lies with each man to determine his own share in the responsibility."

These are sober words, even if they were suggested by an eclipse. Heaven has many ways of speaking to nations.

## NOT AFRAID OF COMPETITION.

As will be remembered, when the hitch in the negotiations for the sale of the water bonds authorized by the city occurred, an effort was made to make it appear that the New York corporation with which the negotiations were carried on, refused to further consider the matter, because of the formation here of a local insurance company. That assertion, however, is nailed down by the fact that the Mutual life now has signified its willingness to take the bonds as soon as a certified copy of the ordinance relating to the matter, is received. The facts seem to be, that the enemies of progress here hoped to delay the work of enterprising citizens for an increase of the city's water supply, by instituting litigation. For that reason they suggested to the company that the bond issue was illegal. But, in order to conceal their tactics of obstruction, they endeavored to place the blame on the local insurance companies.

We are able to state, on the authority of a gentleman representing an eastern insurance company, and not connected with Church, that he, for one, does not regard the formation of a local insurance company as any detriment to the business of other companies. On the contrary, he thinks it will benefit them all. His reasoning appears very logical. He points out that quite a few people here, as elsewhere, are, on conscientious grounds, opposed to life insurance. But, he says, when influential local men enter that field of business, much of that opposition will fade away, and thus benefit all the companies in the field. That reasoning appears sound.

Legitimate competition is not feared by anyone who is engaged in a legitimate business. In many instances it is true that competition stimulates trade, and keeps it alive. One by one, the falsehoods that form the stock-in-trade of the slanders of Utah burst like soap bubbles.
