LIGHT WIND, MIST, RAIN.

Two Yachts Followed by a Large Excursion Fleet.

TALKING AS EXCELLENT CRUISE.

In the American Room. When the Day Above a Boat Existing.

Following are the bulletins of the race:

12:30 p.m.—Defender holds fast, Vicky goes on to distinguish the fog and steam now 50 feet.

12:45 p.m.—Vicky crosses at 219 p.m.

Highgate, 12:45 p.m.—Weather hazy, strong wind, two or three miles an hour. The boat will probably be missed.

1:15 p.m.—Vicky has gone from the point three miles east from the southwest.

Light winds are going down rapidly about five miles an hour.

1:30 p.m.—Fog—The wind has dropped to half miles per hour.

Highgate, 1:30 p.m.—The weather is very light and hazy. The boat is about one mile south from Northwicksay.

1:45 p.m.—Yacht started a race.

Highgate, 1:45 p.m.—Defender crossed about three miles off. Vicky is about 10 miles off.

Highgate, 1:45 p.m.—The weather is very light and hazy. The boat is about one mile south from Northwicksay.

2:15 p.m.—Yacht started a race.

Highgate, 2:15 p.m.—Defender crossed about three miles off. Vicky is about 10 miles off.

2:30 p.m.—The compass fleet is humping along and the boats are all going down way through the scheduling fleet.

Naomi has a green flag side which means boats are to the westward of the yacht.

Vicky is about 10 miles ahead and appears to be sailing steadily.

Highgate, 2:30 p.m.—Defender is about 10 miles ahead and looks like it is to the westward of the scheduling fleet.

Highgate, 2:30 p.m.—Vicky started a race.

Highgate, 2:30 p.m.—Defender started at 12:30. Vicky about five minutes ago.

2:45 p.m.—It was a false start and both were re-called.
