Food Man Kept Busy—During the month of August the city food inspector has condemned 784 pounds of meat as unfit for consumption along with 45 pounds of other food and he investigated five convictions. Inspections were made of 21 slaughterhouses and 134 meat markets with beneficial results to the consumer.
