PRINCE CON. FINISHES WINZE.

Mendha-Nevada in Position to Ship
Good Tonnage—Is Blocking
Out Much Ore.

Ploché is getting into a position to be one of the highest lead silver camps in the entire west, is the verdict of a large crowd of Salt Lakeers, who returned from that famous producer this morning. There is more activity being shown now than at any time since the boom of the boom of the faded away. Among those who returned this morning were Murray C. Gibbs, John R. Cook, T. R. Ellerbe, Charles Reed and Charles A. Quilley.

The properties to the southwest of Ploché, just over the hill from the camp, are showing great activity. It is said, A. M. Low, the Topham millionaire, with C. H. Thompson, Mayor John S. Bransford, and George E. Cox, are putting in a large amount of money in the three properties they are interested in. Dean R. Low, son of A. M. Low, is representing his father's interests. At the Ploché Gold and Silver Prince property the excavation work has been done, and the new 25-horse power hoist is being installed. At the Ploché Gold and Silver Prince the shaft is going down at a lively clip. The Ploché Gold mine, which is one of the latest acquisitions of the same people, is being shaped up for extensive development work.

The Ploché King now has its shaft down past the 150-foot level and is sinking at record breaking time.

The mine connecting the 40-foot level with the 550 has been finished at the Prince Consolidated and the mine is now well supplied with air that will send development work ahead at a good rate. The vein which was recently encountered in this part of the mine is being opened up and getting better every day. The drift is now in a full grade of lead-silver ore of a very high grade. Some of the ore taken from the vein is as high as 400 ounces in silver and 40 per cent lead. Although considerable prospecting work is being done, a large amount of ore is being blocked out.

WORK AT THE MENHA.

The Menha-Nevada is now in better shape than it has ever before. At the present time the company could easily handle from 25 to 30 tons of ore a day and has a large reserve blocked out. This ore will all average \$25 a ton. In the development work that has been carried on at the property under the present management over 2,000 tons of ore has been taken out and shipped.

This property is 8 miles from Ploché and will be greatly benefited by the proposed road around the point of the mountain to the south of Ploché. Advantage has been taken of the low price of metals to equip and develop this property for future production. The wagon haul of the mine is not very heavy and with the new road this property would be made into one of the biggest mines in the district.

Since taking over the property John R. Cook has done considerable development work along the bedded veins that crosscut the vertical fissures. WORK FORCE AT LOG CABIN.

Beach-Hill Property in Bullion Canyon
Reported to Have Made a
Fine Gold Strike.

Maryslee people who have occasion to visit Richfield this spring all concur in the sentiment that the 'vale is on the eve of a great awakening. The financial depression which spread its octopus-like tentacles over this western country in 1907 affected mining camps most disastrously and the healthy districts in central and southern Utah were not exempt from the staggering blow then inflicted, says the Sevier Valley Sun. The putting to the test the prosperous mining camps on Gold Mountain and the entanglement and closing down of the mills were disastrous calamities to the welfare of the Sevier valley and affairs on Gold Mountain still continue to be in chaotic and unimproving condition which may require another year to properly adjust. Therefore, it is pleasing to say the least, that old-time conditions give promise of soon being restored in the Maryslee region.

The snow still lies deep in the mountain canyons and gorges adjacent to the 'vale, and several weeks must necessarily elapse before exploration and the renewal of development work is re-augmented in the dozens and scores of properties which a few years ago drew strings of tourists to the old districts and one of the real producing camps in the state.

Old conditions, if we are to believe the optimistic statements of well known mining men, are to be restored in this historic camp.

WORK AT DEER TRAIL.

One of the most important bits of information to find its way into the Sun office is that the Salisbury people, who have been working quite a force on the famous old Deer Trail the past winter, are feeling so elated and buoyed up with the results of the work done that they are now seriously contemplating the building of a mill on the property the coming summer. The Deer Trail was one of the old producers in the years gone when it was managed by the late O. J. Salisbury. Old veterans of Maryslee have not forgotten the time when it was a regular shipper of the precious metals. Within the past few months a particularly promising ledge of gold bearing quartzite, 1,000 to 1,500 feet in length, developed and there are those who say that the ore will assay high, carrying upwards of 100 in gold to the ton. The Salisbury people are feeling so confident of the permanency of this latest strike that they can see their way clear to putting in a mill on the property. What the Salisbury will be able to do in the future is not yet known. Important properties that will be heard from in no uncertain tones, and the coming summer gives promise of glowing in renewed activity in a formerly famous district.
