Washington Notes.

WASHINGTON, 20.—Col. Hatch

spoke the following from Santa Fe,

New Mexico: "The fact is that

the hostiles have taken many horses

from ranches near Chihuahua. Ar-

izona, an old Indian fighter, who has

50 men with him, says that most of

the hostiles are 40 miles southwest of

Gallegos and the same distance north

of Chihuahua. They go into Gallegos

trade. They are not killed people.

I think they will cross below

Quitman. Five Indians crossed on

July 4th. Captain Brinkhoff is

looking for them at El Paso.

It is said the State Department is

in receipt of satisfactory proof that

a Spanish ship named the *Nuncio*

died upon our frontier of the

Cuban coast. Reports also say the

Spanish Government does not in-

tern deny, but says it is not al-

leged were committed, they were

Illinois Colored Conventions.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., 20.—The first

convention of colored men ever held

in the State was held to-day. One

hundred and twenty-five delegates

were present. The committee ap-

pointed John R. Johnson as presi-

dent. The resolutions strongly set

forth the duty of colored men to

the republicans who freed and pro-

tectioned them, and return everlast-

ing devotion to the republican can-

didates as statesmen and patriots.

They say:

Resolved, That we have been charged

terest of the democratic party, and

intention or purpose to give aid or

comfort to the democracy, either by

thought, deed or action, but on the

enemy to the negro, seeking willow
