MINING STOCKS DEVELOPMENTS IN GREAT DEMAND AT THE PRINCETON

Heavy Dealings in Ajax, Tesora And Victor on the Exchange. Very Encouraging Disclosure in City Creek Canyon Claims.

PRICES GENERALLY FIRM. CALIFORNIA IS IMPROVING.

Ajax Advanced—Victor Weakened—Boss Tweed Stronger—Tesora Declining.

Another heavy day's business was recorded on the mining exchange today. Lower Mammoth was one of the features of the call. Sales were made all the way from \$2.75 as high as \$3.02, while Daily West continued to sag. Sales were made between \$3.00 and \$3.45, Ajax was very active between \$1.45 and \$1.50, while Carina opened at \$1.35 and declined to \$1.33 before the call closed. Star Con. moved up to 40 and afterwards sold at 38 1/2, while Tesora weakened from 70 to 65 1/2 with a slight reaction at the close. Uncle Sam sold at \$1.80. Ben Butler was traded in at \$1.80. Boss Tweed moved up to 63 and closed strong. Victor was very active, but prices were weaker. Sales were made as low as 55 at the close of the call. West Morning Glory was traded in at 6 1/2.

CHEERFUL AT RED WING.

Six-foot Face of Ore Reported in Foot of Drift Yesterday.

A. J. Orem, who returned last evening from Bingham, reports the Red Wing property to be looking well. Notwithstanding the fact that the company marketed seven cars of ore—about 140 tons—during the past two weeks, management has about 40 tons more on the dump. The ore chute is still holding out and the management is expecting to have another 100 tons on the market about the end of the month.

CROWN POINT DEVELOPMENTS.

Results of Running a Drift Across the Eureka Claim.

Arrivals from Tintic report an amusing circumstance between a well known Eureka mining company and the Crown Point company, which is controlled by the Morgan group. Hocking Valley advanced 3 1/2 and Canada Southern rallied 3. Large blocks of Amalgamated Copper were then unbacked driving it to 10 1/2 and causing a sharp setback in other active stocks. American Smelting preferred lost 1/2.
