To the competitor making the highest aggregate score at 200 and 600-yard ranges, a silver medal. To the competitor making the highest aggregate score at 800 yards, a silver medal. To the competitor making the highest aggregate score at 1,000 yards, a silver medal. To the competitor making the highest aggregate score at all ranges, including the skirmish run, a silver medal.
