WHEAT SIX FEET TALL.

Splendid Sample From Near "Mormon" Colony at Gridley, Cal.

A sheaf of wheat nearly six feet tall and bearing heads fully five inches long, was brought to the "News" today by Joseph J. Giles of Provo. The grain was grown at Gridley, Butte county, Cal., on a farm of the Sacramento valley, and near the settlement recently formed by Mormon colonists at Gridley.

The field from which the specimen was taken is owned by Hon. G. K. Smith, and is three miles long and one and one-fourth miles in width, being about the average of many farms and meadows in that locality. Lands are selling at from \$15 to \$100 per acre, and the region is famous for the quantity and quality of grain produced. Eight thousand cars of fresh fruit are shipped from the Sacramento valley annually, and much of the best of it is raised at Gridley and Gridley, Cal. The latter place is doing splendidly this season, and a canal has just been completed for the opening up of new lands.

The hay season is now on and there is a great demand for laborers, wages being from \$2.25 to \$2.50 per day, with board thrown in. Women and girls earn from \$3 to \$4 a day in the orchards. Mormon colonists are offered every inducement to settle in the valley, on account of their success in irrigation and wool growing, the sobriety and industry manifested by them.

KILLED BY LIVE WIRE.

Supt. William Bull Meets Death in Lower Mammoth Mine.

(Special to the "News.")

Mammoth, Utah, May 31.—While showing three friends through the mine early last night, Supt. William Bull of the Lower Mammoth was killed by coming in contact with a live wire on the 1,200-foot level. He had been to Spanish Fork during the day and was accompanied by J. J. Banks, Al Rockgill and Ed Greer, whom he was showing through the underground workings at the mine. They had reached the level mentioned above and had started off in the direction of shaft No. 2. When they had gone about 25 feet, Bull was explaining the electric power system used in the mine and reached up to show them the wire when his hand came in contact with it and he was immediately knocked senseless.

He was hurriedly taken to the tunnel level, where he died. The wire which caused his death was carried at 110 volts, but it was not at the time and Mr. Bull was standing on damp ground, as the shock proved fatal.

The dead man was well known in mining circles and was very popular. He had been superintendent of the Lower Mammoth since 1899 and had been very successful in that capacity. He was about 40 years of age and was married. He belonged to the Thistle Lodge of Elks and was also a member of the Knights of Pythias. Arrangements for the funeral have not been announced.

SECURED THREE DOLLARS.

He Snatched Young Lady's Purse and Demanded This Amount Before He Would Allow Her to Proceed.

Another local robbery was reported to the police last night, the victim this time being Mary Kerswell, a young woman from Springfield. The hold-up occurred on Second Street near First West about 9 o'clock, and the man who did it wore the uniform of a soldier. He appeared to be slightly intoxicated and terrorized the girl, under penalty of death, into giving him \$3. Officer Paxton late last night and he was identified by Miss Kerswell as her assailant. The man claims that he can prove an alibi and the officers are looking for another man who also answers the description given by the young lady.

Miss Kerswell had just returned from school and had started to walk to the home of her aunt, who lives at 721 South Third West street. When near First West street a soldier stopped her and grabbed her satchel, declaring that it belonged to him. The girl insisted that it was her property whereupon the soldier asked her to describe its contents, which she did. He then refused to give it to her until she had given him a dollar. The young lady complied with his request and then started on her way.

The soldier followed her and demanded that she give him \$2 more, or he would kill her. She was thoroughly frightened and gave him the money after which he hurried away. The girl went to the home of her relatives and told about the robbery. She was taken to the police station when the affair was reported to the officers.

DENVER AND CONVENTION

Will Consider Protests of Colorado Water Users Against Alleged Govt. Usurpation.

FORMAL ADDRESS IS ISSUED.

To Have Resolution Against "Government by Rules and Regulations and Not by Law" Adopted.

Denver, May 29.—The scope of the land convention to be held in this city June 18, 19 and 20, has been enlarged to include consideration of arid land reclamation. This will bring before the convention the protests of Colorado water users against alleged government usurpation of their rights in the San Luis valley. Colorado is not the only state interested. Similar conditions are said to exist in the states of Idaho, Washington and Oregon.

An effort will be made to have the convention adopt a resolution against what is called "government by rules and regulations, and not by law."

An address was issued today by the program committee, of which Senator Henry M. Heller is chairman, outlining the objects of the convention. The policy of the government regarding public lands from the adoption of the Constitution up to the present day is reviewed in detail.

"Recently," the address declares, "there has apparently been a decided change in the policy of the government in regard to these lands. The new policy seems to involve the perpetual ownership and control of these lands by the United States under conditions that approach dangerous usurpation of the rights of the people."
