We do not write to alarm any one, nor to make a sensation. We state the facts which all history attests. The readers of The Science of Health can judge for themselves what importance to attach to the subject. That the conjoint perihelion of all the large planets of our solar system, one of which, Jupiter, is a thousand times as large as the earth, must disturb our atmosphere and temperature very considerably is probable; that this disturbance must be injurious to health and life is certain; and that these periods have heretofore been pestilential, is a matter of record. How much we shall suffer during the next dozen or fifteen years, depends very much on how nearly we live a life in accordance with the laws of life. - Science of Health.
