SILVER KING FILES ANSWERS IN COURT.

Denies that Magnolia-St. Louis Mining Co. Owns Any Property in Camp of Park City.

ADMITS EXTRACTION OF ORE

From Ground in Dispute, But Manager Kearns Says Company Lost (?) Money in so Doing.

The Silver King Mining company, by David Keith and Thomas Kearns, president and manager, respectively, filed an answer in the federal court yesterday afternoon in the trespass and damage suit instituted some time ago by the Magnolia-St. Louis Mining company, of which James McGregor is manager.

"These defendants deny that they, or either of them, at any time committed any trespass whatever upon any mining claim or property whatever of the plaintiff, or mined, removed or converted any ores or minerals therefrom, without the title thereto. And they deny that they, or either of them, at any time, ever willfully, unlawfully or without right or title, mined or extracted any ores or minerals whatever from any premises or mining claims of said plaintiff, or any of its predecessors in interest."

SILVER KING CLAIMS ORE.

"Defendants further answering said paragraph of said complaint, allege that all the ores and minerals ever at any time found or discovered in or beneath the surface of the mining claim mentioned and described in said complaint, or either of them, were and are the property of and owned by the defendant above named, Silver King Mining company, and that said plaintiff has not now, or at any time, predecessors in title or interest ever had any estate, right, title or interest in or to the ores or minerals ever at any time found or discovered in or beneath said mining claims or any of them."
