## SHIPSON THE LAKES.

CANADA HAS BUILT THREE CRUISERS,  
BESIDES THE TREATIES.

REGULAR COMMERCE DESTROYERS,

SAYS THE CANADIAN MINISTER OF JUSTICE  
SAYS THEY ARE ONLY REVENGE  
CULTURE.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—A special to the *New York Times* says the three cruisers, not exceeding 10,000 tons, each, equipped with one eighteen pound gun each, have been built at the shipyards on the lake Ontario, two such vessels being the upper lake, and one such vessel at Lake Champlain. One of the ships was built at the shipyards in which the Canadian cruiser was built, while the other two were only recently ordered.

The study stipulates that the naval force of each country consist of not more than twenty vessels, not exceeding 10,000 tons burden and equipped with one eighteen pound gun each, to be built on the lakes Ontario, the upper lake, and one such vessel at Lake Champlain. One of the ships was built at the shipyards in which it was agreed that the two armed vessels on either side should be dismantled and the other vessels of war should be there instead.

The Canadian government has built three cruisers on the lakes since 1892, the *Cluey*, the *Constance* and the *Constance*. *Wakat*, of the Dominion Naval Protective service, quotes in his report in 1892 the following description of the cruiser:

"The *Constance* and her sister ships are built to the boat maintained size by the United States revenue department. In case they were ever needed for such purpose, they would make very formidable opponents to the American naval forces."

The frame of the *Constance* is made of steel, weighs heavy, with steel plates for the top deck. The bottom is of wood. The main deck house, engine room, steering gear, etc., are all of steel, as well as the protective armament, which consists of four guns of 120 pounds each.

The coal bunkers are situated on the side to protect engines and boilers.

The *Constance* has a registered tonnage of 1200 tons."

It will be an interesting question to know whether the agreement to limit the revenue cruisers may be carried out in construction, and where the line is drawn between a revenue cruiser available for revenue purposes only, and one that may be put to more extensive or alternative purposes, such as exigencies demand.
