He selected the space, 15 feet square in section "U,' all of which you know of, as we talked it over at Joplin, and after I had violated the Garden rules by holding space without any deposit. I had done this for Nevada and I thought it only fair to do the same for Utah. . . I have not as yet told the Garden people and I am afraid to do so, as it places me in a very bad light for I am mak-ing an ungodly struggle for the mining industry, and one of the biggest min-ing states has dealt me the hardest blow I have had.' "The statements and correspondence published above give a full and ac-curate account of the negotiations which have been carried on between the president of this mining exposi-tion and the governor. It has been thought best by the governor to pub-lish in all the papers a full account of the transactions connected with the matter. The only comment he wishes to make is that the later correspon-dence fully justifies, in his opinion, his action in declining to make an exhibit from Utah at the exposition."
