

FROM ST. GEORGE TO ARIZONA.

Starting from St. George on the 10th ult., although no spies had returned laden with the fruits of the land of promise, our party was buoyant and hopeful. A good outfit, congenial companionship, and appetites sharpened by the fatigue of camp life, made the trip a pleasant one, till our arrival at Pierce's Ferry, on the Colorado. There we found the facilities for crossing of such a primitive character as to require both skill and caution to insure successful results.

However, everything went on swimmingly, till we came to the last load, which consisted of two oxen that walked into the little boat reluctantly, and with ominous glances to the right and left as they saw the troubled waters. When the boat was shoved from shore, the loading was found to be too much for them, and the cattle made it worse by settling back towards that portion of the boat, which soon caused it to dip water. The river is wide and comparatively sluggish at this point, but a short distance below it rushes down a fall, the roar of which is sent back from cliff to cliff of its precipitous banks. When it became apparent that the boat must sink, the oxen were loosened from their fastenings, when gliding gently over the stern as the boat went down, they were allowed "to paddle their own canoe," which they successfully did to the "bourne" from which they came. In the mean time the boat was being hurried across the river by a couple of Piute Indians, who pulled manfully at the rope till the under current catching the boat, forced it from the rope. The Indians then jumped overboard and swam ashore with considerable difficulty and the aid of an oar, leaving J. E. Stevens and Swann Neilson on the boat. These two made a hard struggle to bring the water-logged craft to shore, but was caught in the suck of the rapids, and all efforts to bring her to land were futile. Peter Nasstrom came to the rescue with a small boat, and Neilson getting in with him, they succeeded in getting hold of a long rope (the shore end of the ferry rope) that was thrown by friends on shore. The rope being fast on the opposite side of the river would of course draw them to that side as they glided rapidly down stream, but they stayed with it till their boat filled and was forced from under them, when they were fortunately near enough to shore to get out all right, but on the wrong side of the river.

In the meantime it was an open question whether Stevens was running the ferryboat, the boat running him, or the river running away with both of them. Stevens did pretty good average work with an oar till the boat was fairly in the bite of the falls. Then laying aside his useless oar, he drew off his coat and watched the current of events and of the Colorado. But after a series of bumps and plunges that would arouse the envy of a bucking mule, the boat rocked and rolled in smoother water below the falls, when Stevens, waving his hat and shouting to the anxious friends on shore that all was right, bent himself to the oar and successfully landed the boat. This being regarded as a sufficiency of adventure for one day, the little party soon drew the "drapery of their couches about them and lay down to pleasant dreams" (we heard that before). Another day fixed matters all right, and our little party left the Colorado river with a realizing conviction that "distance lends enchantment to the view."
