Editor Deseret News: As the "read news" of Lake View very seldom appears in your paper, I thought it might possibly interest some of the readers of your very valuable paper to hear how we are progressing in our little town.

We have a population of about two hundred and thirty souls, with fairly good crops well represented. The locality of our residence is well attended by a good school, a Relief Society and Primary Association in good running order.

During the winter months our Y. M. M. L. A. and Y. W. M. L. A. were held regularly every Monday evening, and had a good attendance.

The health of the people is generally good, there having been but one death during the year, and that being an elderly lady, who had attained the age of seventy-four. Thus far in 1895 we have had but one death, that also being an elderly lady, who had lived past the allotted time.

Accidents are very few and far between—nothing of a serious nature having occurred in our place of residence, excepting the grasshoppers, they have destroyed the majority of the crops for the past three years, and I expect will do so again this year.

They are particularly annoying, as do not seem to be troubled with mosquitoes, as they generally frequent swamps, and come in their way in the line of vegetation. As with it all, I think we really have no serious cause for complaint, which I feel the desirous accounts of health, grasshoppers, etc., that the people of Nebraska, California and other places have to contend with.

We have sufficient to eat and wear, for which we should be very thankful. We have no pecuniar in the way, but do not from what I can learn the majority of the people are about equal in financial affairs.

I will endeavor to give you an account in brief of how we celebrated the Fourth of July. We were awakened at twelve by a salute, and then proceeded from our beds we enjoyed the music and the music floating in the air, the flag flying, and the fireworks.

At 10 a. m. we assembled at the meeting house, which was very decorated with evergreens, hanging and flags, with the portraits of our great and noble Presidents, George Washington and Abraham Lincoln, placed above the stands. We enjoyed a program consisting of addresses, songs and recitations, appropriately rendered in honor of the day, lasting about two hours.

In the afternoon a picnic was held in the park, and the day and night music played for all. Nothing of a noteworthy nature transpired in the day, and we anticipate a similar occasion on Pioneer day.

Back among Clark Fork Spring we were within a week of the beginning of the season of a commensurate, two heavy frosts, which we are hoping will be quite an improvement to the crops of our little town.

The farmers are very busy harvesting their grain.
