WALDEN'S STREET RAILWAY FRANCHISE.

The question of Street Railway Franchise—Continued from last week.

PETITIONS.

Frank Duster asked to be appointed watchman at the aqueduct in Parley's canyon. His application was endorsed by H. C. Under the law the petitioners can, however, file a petition against the proposed action of the Council even after intention to do the work has been authorized. In the meantime their action in the matter appears premature. Adopted.

CONTRACTS AND BIDS. The board of public works reported that they had entered into a contract with W. W. Wagoner for constructing a water aqueduct to be done on North Temple street, between Fourth and Sixth West streets, together with the necessary grading.
