

MUNICIPAL GRANTS.

The City Railway Company's Franchise Mercilessly Dissected.

THE RAPID TRANSIT'S LAID OVER.

The Proposition to Compel the Telegraph and Telephone Companies to Pay a Full Tax Sprung.

The City Council with customary irregularity dragged its weary length into the municipal chamber again last night for the final wrangle with the application for an extension of the full Salt Lake City Railway company's franchise.

For seventy minutes almost as many questions were informally discussed and the hour was close to nine when the municipal machine was put in motion with the following councilmen at their post of duty: Rich, Folland, Karrick, Hardy, Moran, Horn, Bell, Evans, Lawson, Hines, Ward and Minniss.

THE PROCEEDINGS.
Wantland offered the following which he asked to be made section 5 of an ordinance re-enacting and confirming certain resolutions granting franchises to the Salt Lake City railway company and amending the same:

That the company shall pay into the city treasury annually as a license tax for this franchise and in addition to the ordinary property tax levied on the franchise, a sum equal to one per cent of the gross earnings of said company during a period of five years next succeeding the passage of this ordinance and a sum equal to one-half of the gross earnings annually during the second period of five years after the passage of the ordinance and after ten years the amount shall be one-half of the gross earnings of the city's license tax equal to two per cent of its gross earnings and for the purpose of enacting the city may levy a tax on the gross earnings of said company, said company shall make to the City Council on the last day of January of each year, a statement verified by the author of same showing the amount of gross earnings of said company from all its lines in the city for the year immediately preceding the making of such report.

AN INCREASING TAX.

Hardy introduced the following amendment which the chair raised out of order, on the ground that it was a separate substitute, and the vote of Mr. Wantland was sustained.

That the Salt Lake City Railway company shall pay a special tax on each car per month and every car for a period of three years, and \$10 per car each year thereafter, for the next three years thereafter, and pay on each and every car and during the balance of the life of this franchise.

A motion was then put and carried adopting Wantland's motion.

TO CORRECT MISSTATEMENTS.

At this juncture of the proceedings a communication was read from the committee on franchises and assessments made by some of the councilmen on Tuesday night.

The communication stated that instead of the gross earnings of the company being granted, they will furnish gas to the citizens of the city at a price not to exceed \$2.50 per thousand cubic feet; for the city has all public purposes of street lighting, buildings supplied by the city, and other electric, gas, steam, etc., etc., etc., purposes of any kind, a 10 per cent discount will be made on the above price; said illuminating gas is to be furnished at not less than eighteen candle power, to be subject from time to time to the inspection of a proper officer.

Moran moved to suspend the rules and read the resolution a second and third time, lost for want of two-thirds majority.

and operating the portion of said grange's track so used.

This instant I maintained a great deal of discussion yet and many imaginary complications were pictured by some of the councilmen who were opposed to the sense of the motion. It is to be noted that it is proposed to be the basis of a new system in this city, possibly a general consolidation or a transfer arrangement between existing companies.

NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER.

Moran also offered the following: That every car operated on said line, hereby authorized, shall be painted during the months of November, December, January, February, and March of every year, with a heating apparatus, of a kind and nature to be selected by the owners or corporation engaged in operating and maintaining said car, which shall keep the temperature in said car and heating the same, and the said apparatus shall be operated at such times, during the months named, as the nature of the weather and the degree of the temperature shall require.

Hardy—I move as an amendment that the company be required to introduce a system of electric-fanning in their cars to the summer months.

Allen—No, I do not request the motion.

The Chair—Read your motion to writing, Mr. Horn.

Hardy—I am afraid of this constant daily-fanning and to stop it, move to strike out the existing clause.

Allen—I second the motion.

The Chair—The motion is out of order.

FINALLY PASSED.
