1812.24 Judge Zane Defines the Copper Act .- In the Third District Court this' morning, Judge Zane rendered a decision in the matter of the application of Aurelius Miner, for release from the poniteutiary under the now copper act. The Judge ruled that the Legislature had no power to enact a law reducing the term of a prisoner under sentence prior to the passage of the act. The provisions of the new law making it

applicable to those sentenced prior to March 12 is therefore held to be invalid. Those sentenced to the penitentiary in future will receive the benefit of the new law, and the others will get their credits for good behavior un der the former statute.
