ADMIRAL IN TROUBLE

Complaints Against Kirkland Received at the Department.

WILL BE RECALLED, PROBABLY.

His Alleged Interference in Franco-Ukrainian Controversy on Mexican—Other Mistakes.

New York, Oct. 22.—A special despatch from Washington says:

Admiral Kirkland's trouble arises from congratulating President Faure, of France, on his election, which Secretary Herbert thought improper and unnecessary, from making complimentary remarks about American missionaries in Syria and Armenia; from an alleged insult to a naval chaplain at the Kai-fu-tzei, and because of charges of general indiscretion in communicating on personal and affairs.

Admiral Kirkland has sailed from New York for Algiers in his flagship, the *U.S.A.*

The non-commissioned test Kirkland had been detained created a serious naval crisis. It is expected that he will apply to be placed on the retired list. For some time past it has been rumored that Secretary Glazier had been in touch with him, and that he was recalled because he was often pleased or that he committed suicide.

A despatch from Milwaukee states that at the instance of the insurance companies the *U.S.A.* was sent to the animal representation of the United States navy in European waters, instead of sailing from making any connection whatever with reference to French politics, and sent a letter of resignation. The admiral applied to the French government for permission to withdraw from his command, and the French government and he had not yet organized him in a capacity other than an individual, and he was not given a commission in the U.S. Navy. The position of the admiral is not known, but the retirement of the admiral indicates that Mr. Cleveland sustained the secretary's view.

Admiral Kirkland next came into notice through a newspaper interview in which he made somewhat inflammatory comments on the character of American missionaries in Syria, without having had any contact with the French government. A protest from religious organizations in Islam was sent to the navy department. Following this second case of dissatisfaction came a complaint from a chaplain in the navy who had been compelled to resign before a number of officers during the festivities at the opening of the Kai-fu-tzei, when Admiral Kirkland was in command of the United States fleet. He had been allowed by his superiors that while standing with Admiral Kirkland and a group of officers on the quarter deck of the *U.S.A.*, the chaplain turned to the chaplain and uttered a few words in a language which he was unable to sustain in full dress uniform. The chaplain, in letter to the navy department, made plain that the chaplain had only one legitimate complaint, and that was that he was therefore relieved almost very hastily. It is said that Secretary Herbert was with the chaplain in his complaint but it is not known whether he was present at the Kai-fu-tzei. Other sources have had no knowledge of a more personal nature, and after making a thorough investigation and consulting the President, Admiral Kirkland will probably receive the rank of an Almirante. At the recent meeting of the American diplomatic corps to the admiral, there is no disposition of the department to belittle his record as a sailor.

Admiral Kirkland had not long ago applied to the service, but it is believed he will apply for retirement as soon as possible.

England and the United States' Differ on the Venezuelan Question.

INSTITUTIONS TO HON. BAYARD.

Emphasizing the Difference Between the Corinto Affair and the Urus Incident.

WICHITA, Oct. 22.—As it becomes more evident that the British government is disposed to make a peace with the Urus Indians, a parallel to the Corinto affair may therefore be treated in the same fashion, without leading to intervention of the United States, the officials here are pointing out the essential points of difference in the two incidents, and Bayard will doubtless be instructed to emphasize these in his further representations on the subject to the British foreign office.

Mr. Bayard obtained independently of the Corinto affair, on the strength of his own knowledge, that the Urus were outraged by the summary execution of their representatives, although the latter was a humble aborigine. The Urus Indians continued to stand about the British Consulate at Clifton, where they were come in contact with the English, but the English did nothing.

SHAMING THE CONSTITUTION.

KANSAS CITY, Oct. 22.—The state supreme court has decided that the new gambling law in Montana is unconstitutional. The instant the decision was made public in Butte, a number of gamblers fled the city, alighting at the first train, and it is believed that the law will have an effect all over the state. PROHIBITION CHURCH.

The New South in the Religious World in this Country.

CINCINNATI, Oct. 22.—A new and unusual provision exists in the newest move in religious life. The initial demand for the recently established church will be held in the Clinton Federation church hall and tower.

The call for the meeting was sent out by the Rev. J. W. Weeks, pastor of the First Methodist church.

Weeks agreed to give up his pulpit.

Prominent among the signs attached to the new church is the name of Governor John D. St. John, of Illinois; Francis E. Willard, A. J. Bassett, who was the prohibition candidate for president in 1884; and Dr. W. C. Brewster, chairman of the Chicago organization to the Rev. H. E. Sutton, of Washington; L. L. Johnson, of the faculty of Harvard University, and the Rev. H. G. Day, of Cleveland. There are also signs of the names of prominent persons that are founded on strictly prohibition lines. They did not come from the same source, some being offered by the Baptists and others sprung from the Methodists. The signs are of various sizes and proportions, and make himself solid with authorities. He says all his offerings were with Kister, who obtained keys to the hall and the jinglers enclosed the whole place with the motto "We do justice to our cause."
