

SILVER RESOLUTIONS.

Adopted unanimously by the Independent Silver Association.

On the reconvening of the Independent Republicans, county convention after the Nauvoo went to press yesterday afternoon, a permanent organization was effected as follows:

Chairman, H. J. Kenney, secretary; Mrs. A. V. Taylor, assistant secretary; Mrs. J. H. Davenier and Joseph S. Swanson, sergeants-at-arms; H. N. Standish, the committee also reported in favor of the appointment of the 145 delegates to the state convention who were to be selected at large by the delegates from the various districts.

To the fifty-two delegates to that Lake City two delegates were to be selected by the representation of the various precincts in the convention; the twenty precincts outside the city, forty-one delegates, each county precinct to be represented in all. All the twelve who were not represented, the balance of the forty-six delegates to be selected at large by the delegates from the various districts.
