LOCAL BRIEFS.

This Evening's Services—At this evening's service of the Congregation Montefiore the rabbi will speak on "Except the Lord build a house, their labor in vain who build it."

Fires on Power Water—A. W. Gallacher has filed application for six million gallons of water from Middle canyon creek, Tooele county, for power and lighting purposes, 256 horse power being desired.

Death of Louise Naylor—Miss Louise C. Naylor, aged 42, died suddenly Wednesday evening of acute nephritis. The funeral will be held Sunday at 1 p.m. from the residence, 1175 east Eleventh South street.

Dr. Burdette to Lecture—Dr. Charles A. Burdette, president of the American Institute of Applied Psychology at Cleveland, Ohio, is to lecture next Sunday evening in Unity hall on "Mind, Brain and Body."

Lecture to Bank Clerks—Attorney E. C. Ashton lectured on Building contracts before the Salt Lake bank clerks Thursday evening at the Y. M. C. A. special attention being paid to "offer and acceptance," "sealed instruments," "considerations" and the like.

Regents Ratify Sale—The regents of the Orphans' Home after a very ratifying Thursday afternoon the sale of the old building on State road to the county for \$10,000. The report of the soliciting committee showed that the financial aid sought for is coming up to expectations.

Cheek Finally Returned—A check for about \$2,000 in favor of R. J. Martin of Long Beach, Cal., which was found about a month ago in a mail box in Ogden, has been sent to Long Beach, where Mr. Martin was found by the postoffice inspector. Upon proper identification Mr. Martin will receive the check.

Hansen Stirs Things Up—State Dairy and Food Commissioner Willard Hansen returned Thursday evening from Cache county, where he gave a lengthy lecture on the general condition of agriculture. He also looked after the restaurants in Logan, several being ordered to clean up under penalty of the law. Mr. Hansen found people disposed to comply with the law.

Trustees Meet Next Week—The trustees of the Utah Agricultural college will decide at their regular meeting next week whether they will erect a power plant at the college or purchase power from the Telluride Power company. Inasmuch as the legislature appropriated money for the specific purpose of erecting a college power plant, a legal objection has been raised against buying the power from the company.

Articles on Utah—A series of letters by Wm. H. Curtis, the well known correspondent, is appearing daily in the Chicago Record-Herald on Utah and the Mormons. The articles are given lead position on the front page and are over two columns in length. Last Saturday the correspondent dealt with the free daily recitals at the tabernacle and the way the Church calls its members to go to church and preach the gospel. The article is a refreshing change to the average "first impression." In addition to the story it carries biographies of Organist J. J. McClellan and Tracy Y. Cannon and Edward P. Kimball, his assistants.
