Dr. Murray will investigate.

Fires on State Water.—Julius Kunk filed two applications with the state engineer yesterday afternoon, for 12 sec. ft. of water in the Big Cottonwood district, for 150 horse power the stream to be returned to its channel after use in the turbine wheels. The Snake Creek power company of Provo asks for 24 sec. ft. from Snake creek, for two turbine wheels developing 3,500 horse power, the water to be returned to the stream.

Will Discuss Bookkeeping.—Gov. Spry held a meeting yesterday with State Auditor Jesse D. Jewkes discussing the scheme of calling a meeting of the county auditors and assessors to adopt a system of uniform bookkeeping. A short time the meeting will be called and the matter taken up.
