Little Bell Gets Back Into Active List on Strength of Strike Rumors.

STOCK ORDERS FROM PARK.

Some of the Live Tintic Issues—Sales Of Cedar—Closing Quotations and Sales.

There were some weak spots in the mining stock market today, yet on the whole, things moved off very satisfactorily on the floor of the mining exchange during the forenoon calls. Little Bell of Park City appeared suddenly in the active list after a long period of quiet. It was whispered about the exchange that some quite important developments had been made in the workings run in from the 900-foot level of the Daily West mine. Orders for the stock came in from Park City early in the day. Colorado, Iron Blossom, Black Jack, Uncle Sam Consolidated and Sioux Consolidated were active Tintic stocks. REGULAR CALL SALES.

Stock of This Nevada Company Is to Be Made Available.

Shareholders of the Federal Ely Mining company met yesterday afternoon and out of the 770,000 shares of issued stock, 666,000 were represented. The proposition to change the articles of incorporation of the company so as to make the stock assessable carried by a big vote, but 50,000 shares were recorded in the negative.

A new board of directors was chosen consisting of A. C. Ellis, Jr., L. H. Farnsworth, W. J. Craig, John T. Hodson, R. J. Evans, William M. Bradley and Judge W. H. Dickson. An organization committee was elected for one month, when all power will be given to it. Directors will be called to meet at the mouth of the tunnel, and it is hoped that the task of unwatering the Ontario mine will be accomplished in the near future. All buildings and machinery of both mine and mill have been maintained in first class repair. A residence for the mine superintendent has been built. New cottages have been constructed at the mouth of No. 1 Ontario drain tunnel, which tunnel is used for the transportation of ore and supplies by the Daily West. The new coal bins are so arranged that dump bottom railroad cars may be used, and in this way a saving in the handling of coal will be effected. In forming the miners at the mouth of the tunnel, a saving will be effected by taking the timbers through the tunnel instead of by teams over the surface. All supplies, timbers, etc., can now be taken through the tunnel, and it will not be necessary to keep open a road upon which there has been necessary to do considerable work each spring.

"On account of labor troubles, the mine was closed down from Sept. 25 to Nov. 15. During this time the output of the mine was stopped altogether, and the expense cut down as low as possible. However, it was necessary to have some men at work keeping the mine workings in repair, and the costs for the year were materially increased on this account."

The annual meeting of the company will be held May 20 at Portland, Me. The directors whose term of office expire this year are Charles E. Brooker of the American Brass company, Robert Treat Paine, second president, William G. Sharp and Henry Wertheim.
