

DIVORCE MILL'S WEEKLY GRINDING

Wife Seeks Separation. Man Goes To Jail. Threats to Another.

GRIST HAD VARIATIONS.

No Two Things Were Matched Before Judge Morse Yesterday—Jones Decree to Stand.

Fair divorce proceedings came before Judge Morse yesterday afternoon, one wife and one husband applying for legal separation, while a modification of a decree was asked for in one case, and in the fourth a man was sent to jail for failure to pay alimony to his former wife, as the court had ordered.

Elizabeth Hendry told how that for a number of months her husband, John M. Hendry, had failed to provide the necessities of life for herself and children. Corroborative evidence was introduced, and the plaintiff's prayer for divorce, permanent alimony, the homestead and the custody of the children was granted. The Hendrys were married at Ogden, Feb. 2, 1888.

Nellie Woods was granted a divorce from James P. Woods, upon the ground of non-support. Mrs. Adeline Stewart, mother of the plaintiff, testified in her daughter's behalf. The defendant is a railroad man.

WIFE DESERTED HIM.

According to the evidence of Fred Carpenter, substantiated by Oscar Rollins, his wife, Sarah Carpenter, deserted him Aug. 21, 1905. They were married in Blaine county, Idaho, in 1893. A divorce was granted to Carpenter.

In July last Sarah Parsons was divorced from R. A. Parsons, and on Oct. 31 she was married to a Mr. Jones. The ex-husband yesterday asked Judge Morse to modify that portion of the decree wherein the mother was permitted to have custody of the children. As a ground for this request, Parsons alleged that Mrs. Jones had not been a good sportswoman in charge of her offspring. He alleges that intercooper relations had existed between his ex-wife and Mr. Jones before they became man and wife. These charges were positively denied by Mrs. Jones. Her two daughters, Blanche and Florence, expressed a desire to continue to live with their mother, and Judge Morse refused to modify the decree.
