Fire at Ogden.—About 8 o'clock last night, the stables attached to the Chamberlain House, a short distance from the railroad depot at Ogden, were discovered to be on fire. The alarm was given and assistance was soon on the spot. The buildings were totally consumed. Had it not been for a stream of water from the water works main, contiguous structures would doubtless have shared the same fate. The origin of the fire is at present unknown. Mr. Geo. W. Lashus is the occupant or lessee of the premises.

Infested with Tramps.—The tramps nuisance has reappeared in the southwestern part of the city, particularly in the 6th Ward. That locality is absolutely infested with them, so we learn from residents of that quarter. Artist's Work.—Although Mr. Geo. M. Ottinger's energy has been largely directed in other channels for several years past, he has not discarded the easel and brush of the artist, painting being the leading passion of his life. His leisure time has been exclusively devoted to his favorite pursuit. The result of this application is a collection of excellent pictures. They embrace an unusually wide variety, the subjects being local, English and Mexican. We have had the pleasure of examining his later pictures, some of which are particularly fine, both in conception and execution. One of the most successful, a canyon scene, entitled "The First Snow," is probably the most effective of the group. In nature is strikingly defined and enigmatically introduced to take away the handiness of the purely realistic style. The background consists of a grand mountain, upon which the sun of eventide is shedding his lurid rays. It is one of the finest effects of the kind that, in our estimation, is introduced into any of his productions. It is a picture upon which the eye of the lover of the art never tires to dwell.

The English subjects, sketches for which were obtained by the artist while on his visit to Great Britain, are: Stratford-upon-Avon; Mutford, Suffolk; an English Home; Tyne-mouth, Northumberland. These pictures take the spectator instinctively back to the comparatively quiet, fresh and restful scenery of the Old Country, whose peculiarities are in such refreshing and striking contrast to that of the grand, rough Rocky Mountain region, in which we live.

The particular passion of the artist lies in the direction of Mexican historical pictures, upon which he has necessarily to draw largely upon his ideal resources which are, with him remarkably prolific. The details of these pictures, however, are more or less realistic; the masonry introduced in them being copied indirectly from the handwriting of the Ancient Mexicans. Mr. Ottinger grouping the various styles according to his artistic fancy, and in such a manner as to preserve the balance of his productions. Coville Releasing Matco, is the most acceptable, artistic and beautiful of his later pictures of that class.

Any one who is a lover of the beautiful art of painting cannot fail to experience pleasure in visiting Mr. Ottinger's studio. It is not only interesting on account of the opportunity afforded of examining his paintings, but in scrutinizing the work of his hand and brain a fair idea can be obtained of the workings of an artistic mind, gauged by its beautiful and visible effects. Mr. Ottinger is an artist in the true sense of the word.

Durable.—We notice that a new house north of this office, having its roof covered with metallic shingles, made of sheet iron, pointed to shape, painted, corrugated, and provided with laps to ensure their fitting snugly together, besides being nailed to the roof sheathing as with ordinary wooden shingles. The cost, we are informed, is about \$11 per square when laid, as compared with wooden shingles costing about \$6. They are the first used in this section of country, having been imported from Chicago, and certainly have superior advantages over wooden shingles or slate, in their durability and being fire proof.
