

STILL AT LIBERTY.

"Los Angeles" McDonald, Utah Calico-Gulch, not captured.

HIS CAREER OF CRIME HERE.

Reckoned to the Penitentiary for Three Years—His Escape, Reception and Blame.

It is now three years that "Los Angeles" McDonald, who was supposed to have been captured recently and led into the Indiana State prison, is still almost beyond the question of doubt, enjoying the fruits of personal freedom to which he is not entitled.

"Los Angeles" is well known in the police conservators of state Lake and Clark. He is a desperate and determined young criminal whose entire career is the tale of his life.

He was sentenced to the Utah penitentiary for a period of three years, or the office of grand juryman, on July 10, 1892, he effected his escape. But he was recaptured on May 20, 1893, and made to serve out his sentence. With other criminals he emerged from the "panopticon" Feb. 24, 1895.

He then shook the dust of this Territory from his feet. But he did not walk the ways of reform, and in March, the month after his liberty was regained, he murdered a Denver citizen. Commenting on the case the Denver "Advertiser" of yesterday says:
