SALT LAKE CITY, November 26, 1879. To Hon. John A. Hunter, Chief Justice, presiding in Third Judi-cial District Court, Utah Terri-tory.

The undersigned members of the Grand Jury for the September term of this Court, in concluding their labors, respectfully submit herewith the reports of special com-mittees, duly appointed from among their number, to inspect the their labors, respectfully submit herewith the reports of special com-mittees, duly sppointed from among their number, to inspect the prisons and insane asylums in said district, together with this general report, as adopted in committee of the whole.

the whole. Commencing with the impanel-ing of the Grand Jury on the 1st day of last October, we have, dur-ing our sessions, ending this 26th day of November, 1879, had pre-sented to us the names of nearly 100 persons charged with violations of the laws of the United States and the laws of the Territory of Lake, Ost and the laws of the Territory of Utab. Of this number about 50 have been indicted.
