Property Will Be Increased. The cave-in at the Cactus mine of the Newhouse Mines & Smelters from the third to the fifth level, says the Boston News Bureau, was serious inso-far as it temporarily interfered with production by cutting off the supply of high grade ore. It was not an ex-pensive accident, however, and in the end, may prove of great advantage. The cave-in was not entirely acciden-tal, but the management intended to cave-in only one level, whereas it ex-tended through three levels. The ore is all minerable, however, and, while it is being taken out cheap mining will result.
