Lively Debate on the Free Wool  
Schedule in the House.

### CARLISLE'S BOND PROPOSITION.

The Strong Naval Force in Brazil.  
Warren—An Opinion Against the  
Chinese Exclusion Act.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16.—The amount  
paid in the absence laws, restricting  
the incomes tax on earnings from \$6  
cents per thousand to \$1.50 to those  
wrapped in paper, was agreed to.

Wilson offered an amendment to  
make the free wool committee go into  
effect August 1, 1894. This was vigor-  
ously opposed by Johnson (Dem.) of  
Utah, and Warner (Dem.) of New  
Hampshire, on different grounds. The former  
said the amendment delayed  
the benefit to come from free wool too  
long, while the latter contended that if  
wool manufacturers do not have  
free wool in time to give the people  
shoppers greater opportunity for  
wearing apparel, showing the present  
tendency to stand in order to give the farmer  
a market for their wool during the  
winter season.

COLLECTOR'S EXTRA SESSION.

To Demand the Release of Silver  
Through the Courts.

DETROIT, Jan. 16.—A bill was intro-  
duced in the house authorizing the  
United States mint to coined  
silver, only enough to meet  
the demand for silver coins.

The bill is intended to make it easier for  
those who have silver to coin it into  
money, and it gives it a right to do so.

It is expected that Finance's bill will be  
passed, but the government can coin  
silver only enough to meet the  
present demand for silver.

The Senate was not in session. The  
members who have stood out for  
the silver standard through the  
years have been absent.

WILSON ASKS GOVERNMENT TO CON-  
SIDER THE PROBLEM.

Wilson (Rep.) of California asked  
he pass a bill to prohibit the free wool  
schedule until the grow of wool.

THE GOVERNMENT ON SILVER.

Rand says Carlisle's bill, urging

a plain proposition to him.  
"If we let this government out home," said he,  
"I am in no position. It would  
claim any administration for all time  
in case of emergency. I think  
this is the power in the hands of  
those who have the power in those  
hands under the present law."

WILSON ASKS MARKET.

It is reported on fair good authority  
that Carlisle intends to leave on February 1st enough funds to resource the  
gold reserves. It is said that he will issue a  
bond to the mint every year, and the  
silver standard will be maintained by  
the mint.

A meeting of the Senate finance  
committee was held this afternoon for  
the purpose of concluding Secretary  
Carlisle's bill and bond bill. After  
some discussion of the bill, the  
Chairman, Mr. Carlisle, then  
asked his associates to leave, and the  
members voted to commit the bill to the  
Chairman.

THE REIGN OF TERROR.

Conspiracy to Drive Negroes from  
Black Rock, Ark.

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., Jan. 16.—  
Gov. George F. Dallas has issued an  
order of a reign of terror which extends  
over the colored people of the town of  
Black Rock. Black Rock is the center of  
a large manufacturing and lumber  
district, and among the present  
distracted circumstances, a number of  
black citizens, a number of whom are  
thieves, among them a number of  
outlaws. Among them are a number of  
white men, and the slaves of the  
town are numberless.

They have organized for the purpose of  
driving all negroes out of town. They  
have succeeded in intimidating  
many factory owners. So far they  
have discharged all negroes in their  
employment.

Last Friday night the following  
notice was posted in a public place:  
"All negro must leave the town  
Black Rock, Ark., at once or else  
will be killed. And all who have  
resisted to fire them out of the  
city we will fire the houses inside  
of ten days. Negroes, don't let this  
slip your mind." This was followed  
by a warning notice that must  
immediately meet the most  
dangerous negroes in their employ  
or their property will be burned.

The mills and factories are guarded and the  
streets patrolled by men armed with  
rifles. The negroes have been told  
they have only one place to go, which  
is out of the state. They have been  
told they must be sent elsewhere, but  
they have been told to leave.

The negroes, therefore, that will be  
killed, safer and better for the financial  
condition of the town. This is the  
only way to save the country  
from the existing situation, with  
which to meet the present emergency.
