WAR IN VENEZUELA.

A SECRETARY HAD BEEN KILLED AND WOUNDED.

NEW YORK, March 18.—A cablegram from Caracas, Venezuela, to the Herald announced that the conflict between the government and rebels had continued in open war, and that a bloody struggle was fought between a body of revolutionaries and government troops at the village of Aragua. The rebels, with the exception of a few, were beaten by the government, but fear is generally expressed that this is but the beginning of a long and desperate fight to the end of the rebellion. The number of rebels is estimated at many thousands, and they are approaching the republic like the flood which it was just beginning to emerge. The rebels are well equipped, and it is impossible to tell who the number engaged or the casualties. It has been an open secret that a fight would follow the elections, and such a fight has now begun. The rebels have used every means to retain his power and strengthen his position, while the opponents have also been equally energetic in attempting to overthrow him, in anticipation of a final struggle.

The national elections have been held, and the results are to be expected to be favorable to the government, but it is to be presumed that the government forces were not yet quite prepared. The Vice-President claimed to have been elected, but his followers for several years have been plotting to overthrow the present government and restore the dictator. They are still prepared with arms and ammunition. The opposition says the situation is critical.

Brussels, Chile.

SANTIAGO, March 18.—For the first time since the outbreak of the revolution against Calderon there is open hostility between the elements that combine to accomplish the revolution. The Chilian rebels, who are the most numerous, and that President Montejo means to keep them in the background, and their potent influence will not be rewarded by the position presently to be assumed. The rebels, who are the largest majority of Chileans are Liberals, and the President has concluded to stay with the majority, even if he has to leave the capital. The Chilean newspaper organizes openly calling for the new cabinet.

THE LIVERPOOL HORNOR.

The Bodies of the Victims of the Madrever Incident.

LIVERPOOL, March 18.—The bodies of the two men and two children who were slain at Hale Hill after being murdered and buried by Charles Deering, alias Williams, were buried this morning in the parish church yard, in the presence of a large concourse of people.

At the just now held examination of Deering, the brother of Fred, another member of the Madrever family, it transpired that Deering treated his wife brutally soon after their marriage.

At 1 A.M. he gave the nurse who conducted the religious exercises, denounced the foulish acts of Deering in most scathing terms, and added to the number of "the most infamous men who have ever disgraced the air of England." The immense crowd of spectators showed their abhorrence by loudly applauding these words.

At 10 A.M., at the coroner's inquest, today, in the effect that he saw the murderer committed in a dream, came a great shout of applause, and when the proper time came, he will be able to prove his innocence.
