

TELEGRAPHIC. DAMAGE BY FLOODS.

Several Buildings in St. Louis Washed Away and Lives Lost.

RAILROAD TRACK SWIFT AWAY.

The Ohio River Rising—Scores of Families in Danger.—Farms Under Water.

St. Louis, May 1.—The river at 6 o'clock this morning showed a rise of over a foot since last night and is still rising. At 6 o'clock water had caused the abandonment of the greater portion of East Carondelet. A telegraph office in St. Louis was wrecked this morning and several small buildings washed away. The body of a man was washed ashore near the side of the wrecked telegraph office. Many persons who have been living in the second stories of their homes were forced to move out altogether today and several narrow escapes. At Belleville several manufacturing establishments were forced to shut down, the boiler rooms being inundated.

On this side of the river North St. Louis so far is the worst affected. The district known as "Oklahoma" is now a vast lake with here and there a small island. Many persons are in a very precarious position. The East St. Louis dock warehouse gave way about noon and fully one-fourth of the vast building with its heavy contents fell in a heap, the roof sinking and settling on the wreck. Thousands of sacks of flour, sacks of grain, boxes of canned goods, bundles, staves and miscellaneous lot of other goods were precipitated through the ground floor and into the water. One of the laborers, Charles Tate, a colored man, was crushed to death under the debris. Two other laborers were injured. The loss will be quite heavy, but it is impossible to ascertain the exact amount.

A CLOSING.

Paris, Tex., May 1.—A cloudburst swept the slope of the mountain yesterday and carried away thirty-five miles of the "Frisco" railroad track. The north-bound passenger train which left Saturday was unable to get beyond Mountainburg and returned. A freight train was also wrecked. The Ohio river is leaping up at the rate of four inches an hour. The whole of northwestern Ohio is flooded, and the water is rising. While some crops are delayed that the yield must be small.

AN IMMENSE WATERPOUT.

Harrisburg, Pa., May 1.—At noon today an immense waterpout burst over Trenton city, a village near here. About the same time the river broke its banks and within fifteen minutes the water flooded the town, carrying away, outbuilding and stable and flooding the first floors of residences.

MANY FAMILIES IN DANGER.

Harrisburg, Pa., May 1.—At midnight last night the northwestern portion of the city containing 300 houses are flooded and the water is rising a foot an hour. Scores of families are in danger. Electric car traffic in the entire city is stopped.

FARMS FLOODING.

Alton, Ill., May 1.—In the past forty-eight hours the river has risen nearly three feet and is still rising. South and north of here there are nothing but water wastes. Several bridges have gone out at Wood river and the work of raising has commenced.

REASON FOR ANXIETY.

Davenport, May 1.—The Missouri river has reached an unprecedented height. The water level is still rising. Weak joints in the levees here, and there is reason for anxiety. One hundred and fifty acres of the residence portion of the city is flooded.

TWO WATERINGS.

Van Buren, Ark., May 1.—Two waterings took place at Van Buren county yesterday and washed out bridges and railroad tracks on the Santa Fe. All reports are not in and it is feared the damage done is immense and many lives lost.

C., May 1.—The operations of the treasury department during the month of April were as follows: Net increase of the public debt, \$5,229,819; bonded debt increased, \$421,000; cash in the treasury decreased, \$4,147,254. The net result being an increase of the debt. The interest-bearing debt increased \$500,000; the debt on which interest has accrued decreased \$22,100.
