

SUIT FOR DAMAGES.

A Case Involving International Complications.

DEMAND ON A MEXICAN RAILROAD

To Pay \$50,000 for the Imprisonment Without Cause of an American Citizen.

CHICAGO, Dec. 2.—The Chronicle today prints the following: International complications growing out of the arrest and imprisonment of an American citizen and a tall interpretation of Mexican criminal law will be the features of a trial to be commenced today before Judge Neely, in the circuit court. The suit of Herbert B. Geier, of Chicago, against the Mexican Central Railroad company for \$50,000 damages for false imprisonment to the City of Mexico, which had been pending in the Cook county court since 1893, is set for hearing today, and several prominent Mexicans are already here in regard to the case.

The story of Geier's imprisonment and the subsequent efforts to free him by the United States government, through Secretary of State James G. Blaine, is interesting. In July 1893, an alleged robbery involving \$7,500 took place in the City of Mexico, in the office of the paymaster of the Mexican Central Railroad company.
