As a result of this inves-tigation an effort will be made to comept the sale of the pure article. The law requires a minimum of 14 per cent of cream in the frozen pro-duct. Only two of the samples reach-ed this. The manufactures of the articles blamed the persons who sold them the cream. This phase of the question is also being investigated by the food and dairy commissioner. Mr. Harms made several other tests at the request of Mr. Hanson, Several samples of milk delivered in Ogden were found to be unsatisfactory. Nine samples showed dirt plainly visible to the naked eye. One sample taken from a Junction dealer was unfit for human consumption. It has been reported that a number of local butchers have been using some preservatives to keep their meats. They have been used to sprin-kle over steaks and other expensive tigated.
