It really takes two or three months to thoroughly acustom an athlete of any kind to a change of climate. It is best either to come within a week of arrival, or to put it off for two months or more. The latter Squires did.

After the Australian has made a great hit with the Californians. He looks like a fighter, with his broad angular jaw and his set mouth. He is a quiet, determined sort of a man, with little to say about his plans and little desire to show about his performance past or prospective, says Bob Edgren.

But why shouldn't Squires turn out to be another Fitzsimmons? Even Fitz was not the only great man from the Antipodes. There were others who have turned out nearly as many great fighters as we have ourselves.
