PRESIDENT WILLIAM WOODWARD delivered a discourse on the subject of revelation, showing that it was impossible to conduct the work of the Lord and lead the children without continuous communication with the heavens. He showed why one week was chosen as the instruments of Almighty's presence in these days were chosen as given from the beginning of time. The humble did not take glory to themselves and could be used for the attainment of divine purposes. The speaker also dwelt on the importance of the way for the introduction of His dispensations to the children of men, and related notable instances associated with the setting up and establishment of the Church in these days. He also spoke for some time on the importance of the designation of the latter days, taught through the instrumentality of the Prophet Joseph Smith, and here testimony to the divine character of his calling.

PRESIDENT JONATHAN P. SMITH followed. His address was mainly devoted to a definition of the spiritual gifts of the people. He remarked upon the great change that had taken place in the past year in the condition of the nation with regard to the saints, whose good qualities and works were beginning to be understood. This change had not occurred because of a conversion to the faith which the saints were making, but an account of what they had accomplished in developing the resources of the country and improving the condition of the people. He also dwelt with clearness and force on the necessities of the saints to maintain their independence. Some industries, among a number which had been begun and had not received the degree of support to which they were entitled. His earnestly contended that a religious and patriotic constituency is the basis of material greatness and prosperity.
