Local implement dealers report excellent sales in movies the past few weeks, with the demand running now to threshers and binders.

Sunday evening Philip S. Maycock of this city will lecture in the Fifth ward meetinghouse at Ogden City, his subject being "The Holy Land."

Frank S. Murphy of Perry, Ore., has returned to this city, where he formerly lived, to stay. He has been the property of Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Wilson.

There will be four new clerks added to the local postoffice force on June 1 next. This increase in help is demanded by the steady increase in the volume of business at the Salt Lake postoffice.

The congregation of the First Presbyterian church authorized last evening, the trustees to dispose of the old church at Second East and Second South streets, at the discretion of the trustees.

Good bricklayers are needed in this city. There were enough here early in the spring, but so many feared there would not be work during the summer that they went elsewhere, and now there is a shortage.
