

THAT POLE TROUBLE.

The City Building Company's Petition
against Removal.

The Salt Lake City Railway company has submitted a petition to the City Council protesting against the resolution ordering the removal of its poles and trestles from Second East street, in which it is set.

The recommendation that your petition be referred to remove its overhead wires extending from its power station along Second East street to Fifth south street might not be passed. This proposed action is an assault on the telephone company, upon the ground that these wires interfere with the telephone lines extending along Second East street, and connecting with Murray and Sandy.

Before the removal of the telephone line from that street is effected, you will give your petitioners, in order to secure electricity for the operation of its cable, time to make arrangements to have another line of power installed, making two lines of power from a telephone pole to the house, so that the telephone may be used.

At the commencement of December were finally restored, connection maintained to the improvement.
