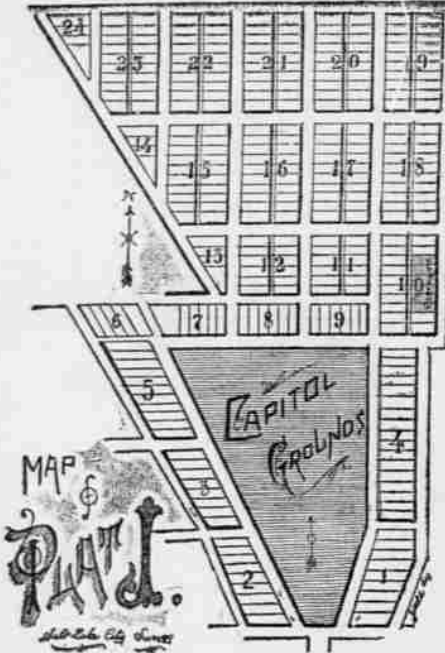


CITY LANDS
