At Dry Creek, Draper Ward, April 23rd, 1880, ELLIZABETH TYLER, aged 68 years, 6 months and 10 days.  
Deceased was formerly from Staffordshire, England; embraced the gospel in early times; emigrated with the last handcart company to Utah, burying her husband, T. Parkinson, shortly before leaving home. She was widely known for her usefulness. Her manst-

kindnesses will long be remembered by those she ministered unto as nurse or friend. She remained in full faith of the gospel, and leaves an aged husband and many friends to mourn her loss.—COM.

In this City, of diphtheria, ZILLAH LOUISA, daughter of William and Zillah Birkinshaw, born September 8th, 1875, died May 6th, 1880.

At his residence in Springville, Utah County, U. T., on the 11th day of April, 1880, SIMMONS P. CURTIS, of heart disease, aged 62 years and 25 days.

He was born in Tioga County, Pennsylvania. Joined the Church about 1835, and was at Missouri and Illinois during the persecutions of the Saints. He came to this Territory in 1852, and settled in Springville, Utah County, in the same year. He was a member of the first High Council of the Utah Stake of Zion and so remained until about two years ago, when he was honorably released on account of ill health. He remained faithful to the Gospel he embraced.

At the residence of his brother, Joseph Everill, at Deep Creek, Tooele County, Utah, on the 25th of April, 1880, about a quarter to 4 p.m., after a lingering sickness of five or six years, of dropsy and heart disease, PETER EVERILL. Born June 10, 1817.

At Spanish Fork, on the 19th of April, TRUELOVE WARD, wife of the late Thomas Ward, aged 77 years and 11 months, late of Leicester, England.

At Franklin, of diphtheria, on the 5th of May, LORENZO H., son of Armentus M. and the late Susan Neeley, aged 10 years, 10 months and 27 days.

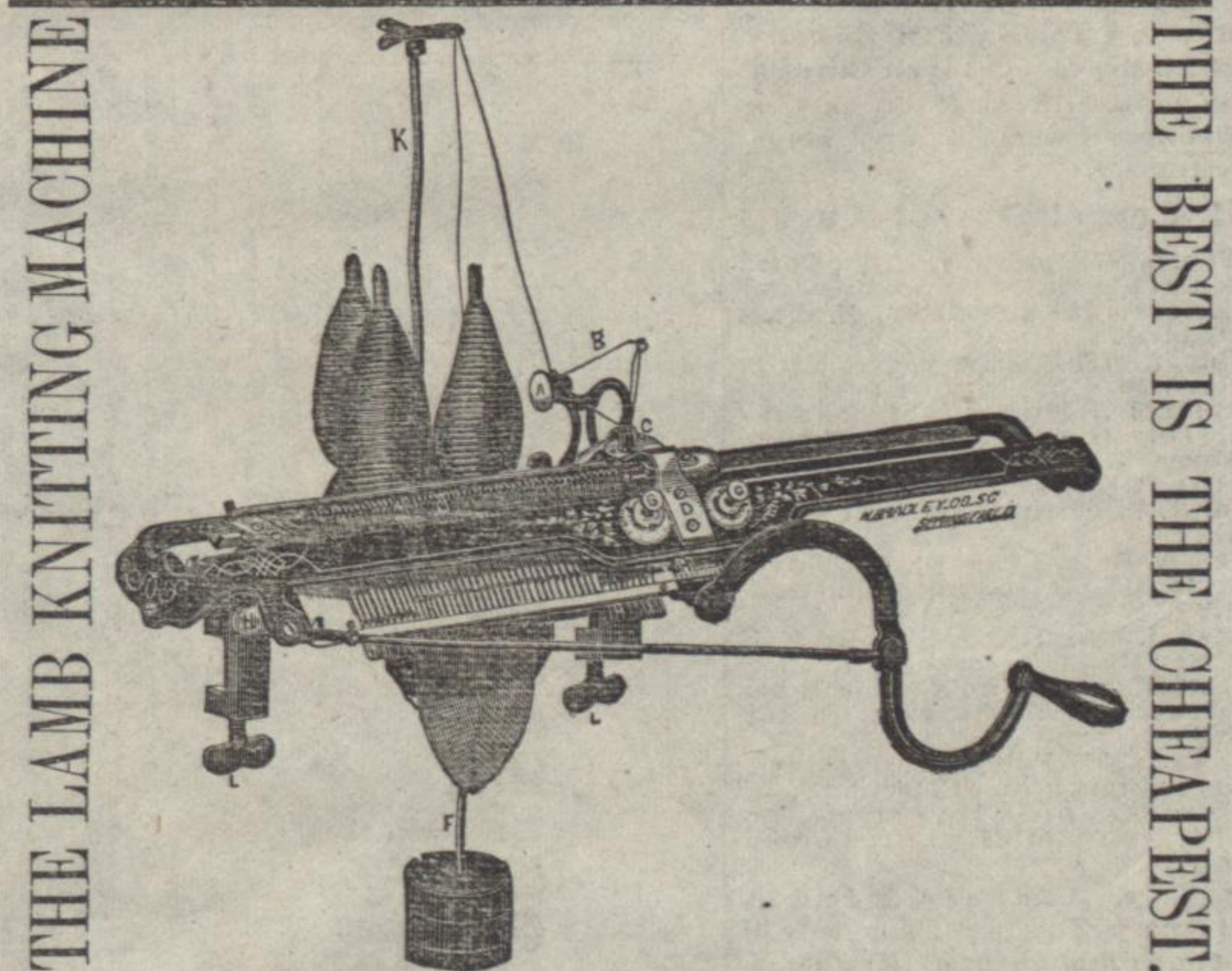

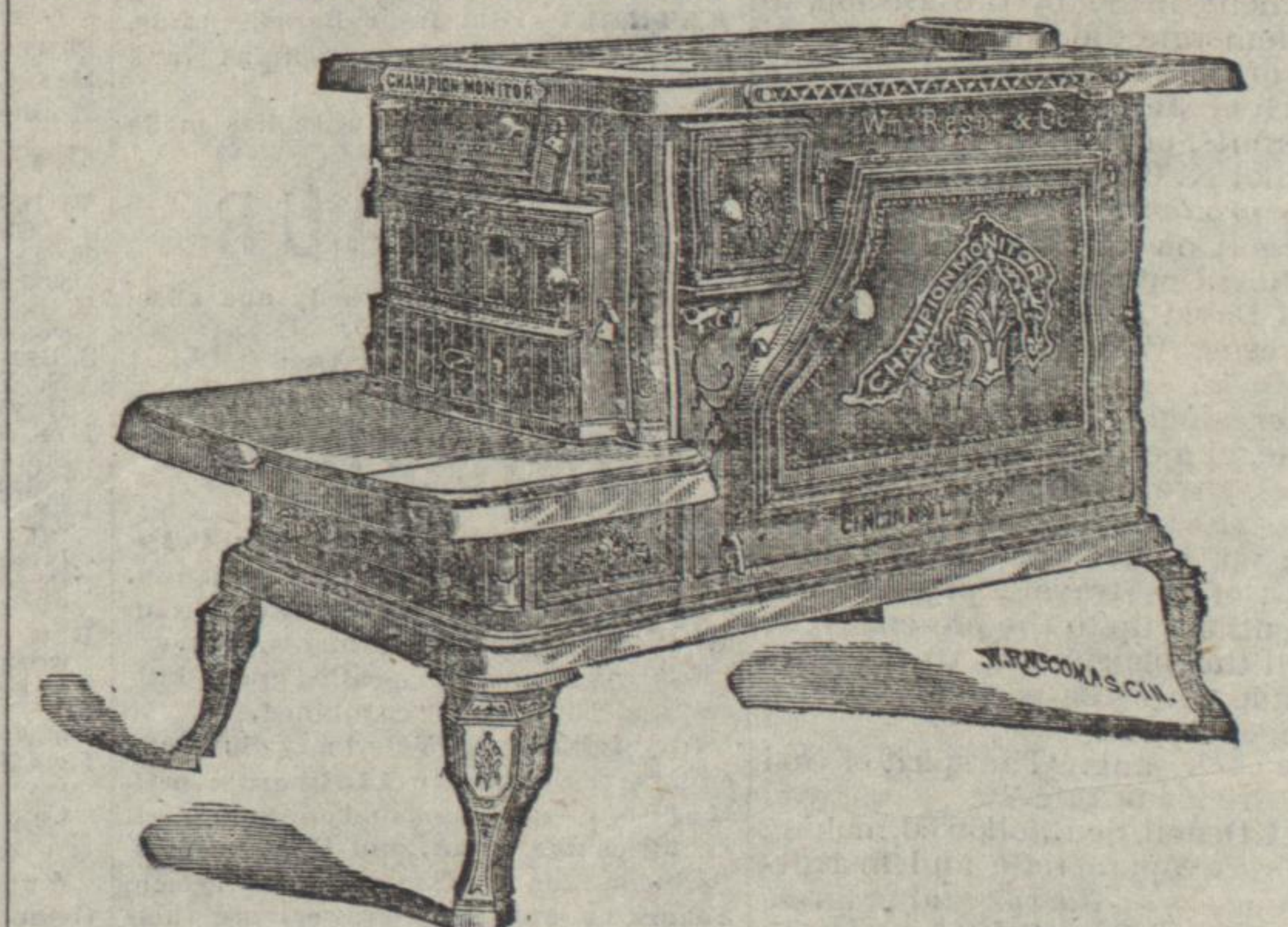
