CREOLE MAY GO TO TREASURE HILL

A Park Cityite Says There is No Doubt About It But Deal is Still Pending.

WOULD BE A GOOD THING.

Exchange of Treasure Hill Shares—What Will Be Done With The Treasury Stock.

The taking over of the Treasure Hill and Kentucky groups of mines at Park City by "Uncle" Jesse Knight and associates has revived the rumor that the Creole mine will also find its way into the possession of the newly organized Utah Treasury Hill Coalition Mines company.

An arrival from Park City last evening declared that there is no doubt about it; that while negotiations have not been entirely closed he was of the opinion that an understanding had been reached as to the basis upon which the Creole will go into the amalgamation and that all but arranging some of the details of the deal is practically consummated.

VIRGIN OIL FIELDS.

Little Home Capital Has Been Invested There So Far.

Milford, Aug. 2.—Those who think the natural wealth of this state should be put to the surface in Utah does not immediately attract attention abroad until it finds again, as witness, The Dixie oil field contains many large quantities of capital from other states than from Utah. H. J. Keate, of Milford, just returned from an extended visit there, during which he became extensively interested, as well as other Utah men during the sojourn, and that was Harry S. Joseph of Salt Lake, although Cedar City's investors are said to have raised \$100,000 to back and push their holdings in the new field of wealth.

But look at this: The first well bored was by Rhylotte and Los Angeles people, and from this they have a daily flow of 80 barrels. Having thus demonstrated the productive capacity of this part of their holdings they are now removing their derrick and boring apparatus to some six miles to the east, and the ground to give it a trial, but in the meantime they have three more well-drilling machines on the way.

GOLD IN THE YUKON.

Ottawa, Ont., Aug. 3.—The Canadian government department of the interior made of the gold-producing districts on the Yukon to see what amount of gold was still to be obtained from placer banks, hillsides and valleys where the pioneer miner with placer methods has skimmed off the rich cream. Four experts spent a season sampling, surveying, boring and measuring the gold. They estimate that there is still almost \$7,000,000 of gold to be taken from gravel which has already yielded \$119,000,000. To recover what is still scattered through the soil advanced methods will have to be used.

OIL IN KANE COUNTY.

Interest Being Taken in the District in Vicinity of Orderville.

Orderville, Kane Co., Utah, July 21.—The oil boom started recently in the vicinity of Orderville, Washington county, has created some interest in this particular portion of the state. The first evidence of this was noticed several days ago when some Cedar City people came over and located what is known as the Black Springs, situated about three miles from this place. In what is known as Trail Hollow, since then many other locations of oil land have been made and everything indicates that the field is to undergo vigorous development.
