Provo, Oct. 15th, 1880.

Editor Deseret News:

I have had several enquiries on the best time for setting out the mulberry trees, sowing of seed, kind of soil best adapted and where can be obtained a market for those raised this season, etc.

Answer 1.—Best time of planting out trees, whether in the fall or spring. I prefer the fall for many reasons. Trees planted in the fall should be mulched and they get ready to shoot out their lateral roots earlier and the trees get settled so as not to be shaken to loosen the earth around them. Many lose their trees from the ground cracking around the stem and letting the air down which dries the fibres and kills them or puts them back.

2nd.—Where not able to plant them in the fall it would be better to get them then and lay them in graft, so as to have them ready as soon as the ground opens in the spring.

3rd.—For kind of soil, etc., see my Treatise on Sericulture. The following being the heads treated upon:

Synopsis of history, cultivation and variety of trees, various kinds of silk worms, diseases of worms. Causes and remedies, feeding, cocooning and hatching, preservation of eggs and cocoons, notes.

4th.—For sale of cocoons apply to A. Milton Musser or Paul Schettler, Salt Lake City.

The last two seasons have been very late on account of late frosts, and in case it should continue it is better to sow this fall some white cabbage lettuce seed, which plant will do to feed on the first five stages, so as to have feed ready at the time of hatching.

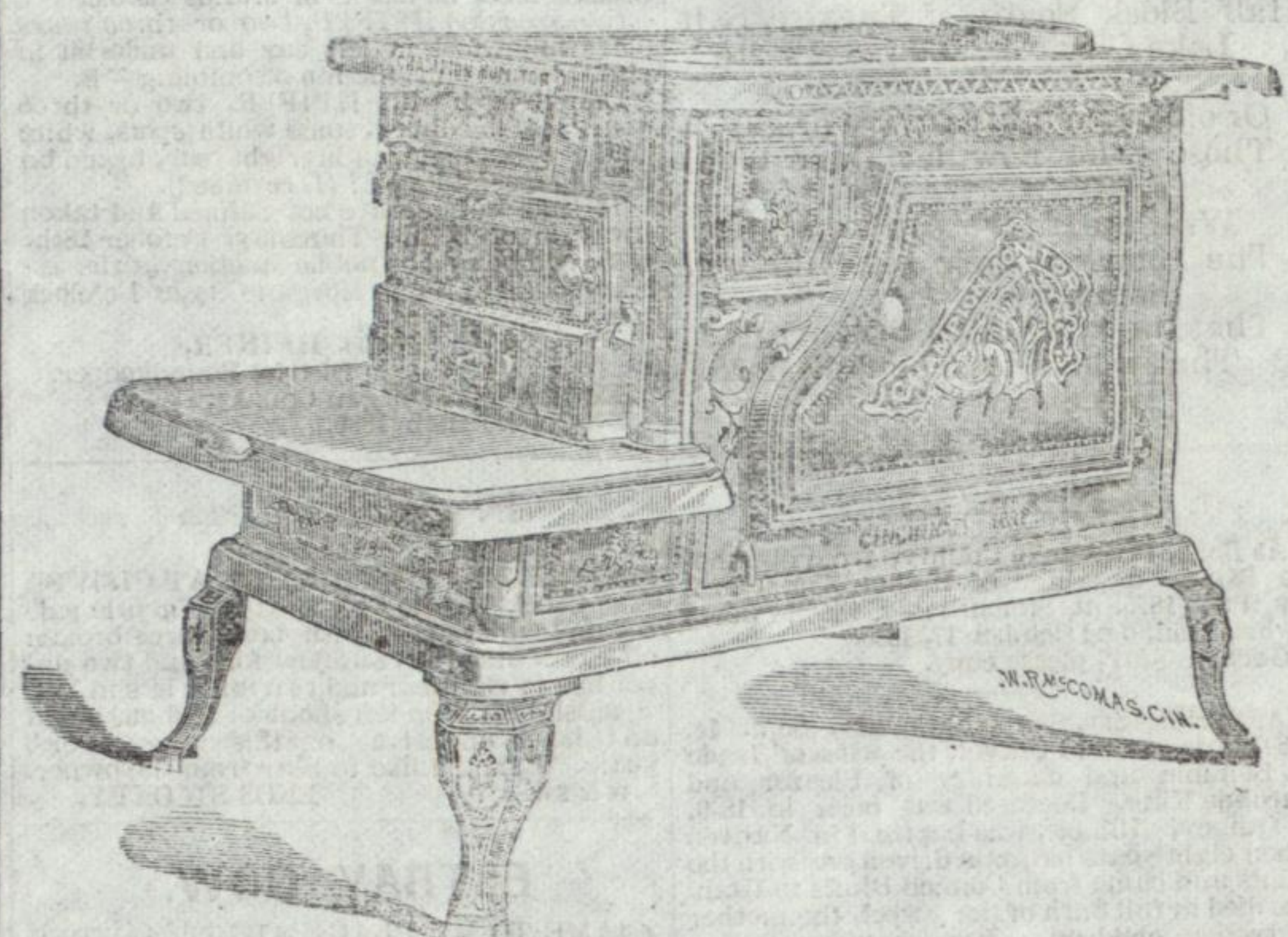
