Washington, D. C., April 25.—The last of the negotiations to secure settlement of the United States in its contention with Great Britain over the rights of the United States to the Pacific Ocean was held yesterday morning at the State Department, between the Secretary of State and the Ambassador of the United States, Mr. W. H. Gwin, and the British Minister, Mr. Edward St. John.

The negotiations were suspended for a short time yesterday afternoon, and again to-day when the two diplomats went to the office of the State Department, to present the final statement of the American position.
