MAY DIVIDE MONTANA

### Talk of Splitting State and Attaching Portions of Others.

There is still tlak from Montana visiors who drop down here occasionally, of a division of the state as a probability at no distant day. The Interests of the eastern part of the state are antirely dvarss from those of the western section, being agricultural and horficulturnl, with some coal mining in the southern parts. West of the one hunrouthern parts. West of the one hun-dred and tenth meridian the great bulk of the interests is in mining, with a few inconsiderably sized valleys. like the Gailatin, the Flathead and two oth-ers, where agriculture predominates. Eastern Montana would have to be giv-en a new name, with Miles City as the capital. The scheme is to take western Montana, northern idabo, and Wosh-ington cast of the mountains, and make a new state, to be called Montana, with the northern line of Wyoning ex-tended westward as the southern bor-der. The bit of Montana lying south of this line would be given to Idaho.
