## THE LEGISLATURE.

The Legislative Assembly of the State of Utah has adjourned after a thirty-day session prolonged on an actual period of fifty-seven days, the last day being extended for a week. It has been a very active session and much work has been accomplished than is generally recognized. When the full list of bills considered, passed and enacted is read it will be seen that the time of the session has not altogether been wasted. Some admirable measures have failed to pass through the opposition of the public and the vigilance of the governors, who appears to have exercised close scrutiny and a wise discretion. The more serious reflection upon the Legislature, will the public sentiment understand, is the failure to secure a United States Senator who will speak up for our cause. The fact that other states have equal delegates will not be deemed palliative in the case of Utah, where men chosen to represent a people like ours should be sufficiently harmonious and unanimous to unite on so important a question. Apart from that the Legislature has done good work, and displayed much ability and regard for the needs of our growing and beloved State.

## COMPLIMENTING LEGISLATORS.

These members of the Legislative Assembly who wear the only armor sheet published in this state, most certainly be charmed with the assault it made this morning upon them and their supporters. Early in the session they were portrayed, by the same claymore hand, as unwise to trifles and of weak mortal nature. Now they are depicted as afflicted with hereditary infirmities—“semen of disease,” inherited from their fathers’ “old Indian” wives; they are compelled to follow, “as the dog turns round several times on the carpet before he lies down,” and resulting in “the violation of the Constitution of the State.” This lack of “good fellowship” and “common sense,” is attributed to the same cause. Their sons and their fathers before them are held up to public execration.

Probably the gentlemen selected by the majority of the voters of the State, to strike laws for the government of the community, are not the men whom the claymore hand has been so anxious to injure. In the various columns of the papers and journals reflected upon them, by bleeding editors in the same sheet, that they are indifferent to the wants cast upon them and their remedies for the language to its editorial columns. If they like that sort of thing, they should continue to encourage it, and sit in its support.

The latest trials against them, and the present Senator from Utah in Congress, is founded on such alleged effort to stifle a United States Senator, that there can be no doubt about it. Monday, March 10th, at midnight, “The trial,” as it is called, of continuing the last legislative day by a hurried action, securing an amendment to the necessary business, the committee and signing of bills, etc., is over. It is considered judicious in various states of the Union, if that is really unadvised or unadvisable, there is a vast class of us here to voice it in different parts of the country than in its initial and end.

The constitutional form of a regular session of the Legislature is determined. That this action caused the “Trial” to be suspended, all the papers seem to indicate that Chancery could not be valid. It is now known that both Houses would want immediate meeting in joint session of any portion of its existence, provided sufficient numbers of members were agreed on the proposition. A half-good judgment and common honesty in the consideration of that question would cause a wide silent in debate before the two houses, and honest citizens and their adherents of a conservative back of their traditions, because they believed, the Legislature could exercise all of its functions while it had existence.

The Deseret News has not advocated any extraordinary proceedings, or supported

opposing senatorial candidates. But it has its eyes open to the facts and the question before presented, and while in contempt the results tested three gentlemen and their supporters who have acted as they believed was in accordance with right principle and for the benefit of the cause of Utah.

## TRUSTEES IN TRUST.

A Deseret paper sees about advantages to this country in the steady growth and rapid multiplication of cities and communities of every kind. According to figures given, in January and February of this year, these towns were separated with an average capital stock of \$10,000,000 each, and the number of inhabitants increased to 10,000, a total sum of \$100,000,000. The population movement is increasing at the rate of \$10,000,000 a year, a sum the magnitude of which the human mind fails to comprehend.

The money in this country insures the combination of capital as well as labor, and may in effect it has done upon individual business enterprise and liberty, but in the inevitable result it will make use the principles of our governments. The time will come, doubtless, when such combination will in itself seek to shape the course of society in accordance with its own interests.

It is true, to see dangers and another to know how to avert it. There are numerous predictions of disaster, but very few suggestions of practical nature. People generally are too much absorbed in their personal affairs to pay much attention to the welfare of the nation and thus leave the latter to the speculators who look out for profits than to the general welfare.

These commissioners were appointed to meet at the earliest possible date in Manila, and the American Legation, the seat of the government of the United States. They were charged with the duty of ascertaining what acceleration in the condition of the inhabitants and what improvements in public order may be practicable, and for this purpose they were to study at length the existing social and political state of the various populations, particularly as regards the forms of local government, the methods of taxation, the means of transportation and other factors of public improvement.
