Switzerland, and has been in force there during ten years, but it has had no effect on the divorce rates in the different cantons. The Code Napoleon allows divorce by mutual consent. This code is in force in Belgium, and it is a curious fact that the lowest rate of divorce in the world is in that country. This question is a good deal like silver and tinplate, the more one studies it, the more complicated it becomes.

Now if the Traveller had cited some instances in which the "Mormon" Church or its Priesthood has ever made any kind of professions and promises which it has not kept, there might be some reason for making that statement.
