A GERMAN BUDGET.

Emperor William is Looking Up Statistics on the Social Evil Subject.

THE PRESS THINK HE IS CARRYING THE BUSINESS TOO FAR.

News of 250,000 German Colonists Flocking for Food—Hunger Making Them Desperate.

THE SOCIAL EVIL.

The Emperor Issues the Minister of Justice to Report.

BRUSSELS, Oct. 31.—Following up his recent speech, the Emperor has caused a report on the laws relating to the social evil, and to formulate measures for the extension of the application of existing laws to cases not covered by them. In the meantime the police are going beyond the law, in order to act in accordance with the spirit of the existing laws of regulating the "social evils."

The press, in criticism of the imperial edict, approves of the strict measures proposed, though at the same time it deplores the fact that the Emperor is using unconstitutional methods of influence.

The various party organs, while they admit the justice of the laws adopted against the means adopted by his majesty, as tending to destroy the government of popular rights.

The origin of the agitation will, it is expected, be the introduction in parliament of severely repressive measures, including flogging and other forms of punishment of hard labor.

In discussing the question, some papers venture to suggest a resort to a general strike, but the Emperor is of vice. To this proposition, however, the Emperor will never assent.

While the Reichstag remains in session on Nov. 1, the Emperor will call a meeting of the Austrian and Italian commercial trustees, and the demand for new military credits will complete the principal business of the session. The Emperor's plan is to increase the amount every year, and to insist on the ground that there is no necessity for a return to the ordinary service, and for a return to the existing conditions.

The question as to whether men capable should be made of bronze or steel, has been referred to the Reichstag, and the extent of use of small caliber has also been decided upon.

There will also be presented to the Reichstag a bill for the improvement of the navy, and the increasing of the number of ships in German waters, and the South American and Chinese stations.

A series of trade agreements being negotiated with the United States, involving reciprocity in the treatment of American grain and pork, and German grain and flour, has been agreed upon by the Austrian party. Their opposition to commercial treaties will be reduced if the treaties with Austria and America are presented simultaneously.

Advises received here state that 220,000 German colonists in the famous districts of the Volga, districts of the Don, and the Black Sea, are perishing miserably. The German committee formed at Bremen awaiting the return of their members, and to be able to make arrangements under treaty pressure.
