

**A BANK CASHIER'S CRIME.**

**Walker Bros.** Paying Teller Under Arrest for Misappropriating Funds.

Very few bank cashiers in Utah have gone down in disgrace. Very few of them, indeed, comparatively speaking, have appropriated to their own use the funds of the institution that trusted them and gave them employment. Amongst other leading tellers and officers employees have been made unknown to the public system of this territory, and that has been the rule, save in one case, a Utah business man.

A case, however, has just come to light in this city which appears to be a sad exception to the general rule. It is found that the cashier of the Walker Bros. bank, in this city, for the past two years has been in the employ of Walker Bros., the last two years as paying teller at the Bank of Commerce, one hundred South street.

On Tuesday afternoon of this week the surprising discovery was made that Tyre was absent from his cash and teller department had been "shorted." It was said that the missing money is made up mostly of small change, and was taken by the cashier during his employment. It is not yet known exactly what was taken, as the work is being investigated.

They got away the train late night, and were last seen in the state apparently trying to keep in touch, and as the express showed up on nearing Green River the men jumped off hurriedly and have not been heard of since.

Last Friday two persons, then supposed to have been a man and a woman, passed through Carter's, but it was believed that the latter was a man wearing female attire, and that the individuals were not seen again. No trace of either was ever made.

The names of Carter's station is about 120 miles, and as the two men wanted to be thoroughly acquainted with the intervening country, Deere means unlikely that the murderers of Sheriff Burns were the men who started the train at Carter's station a few days since.
