Cooke, Grouse Creek, Box Elder County, Utah Territory, SARAH JOY, the mother of Mary Joy, wife of Benja. E. Cooke. Deceased was the daughter of James and Sarah Masterson. She was born on the 15th day of July, A. D. 1798, at Diss in the County of Norfolk, England, thus lacking but two months and two days of being 83 years of age. She obeyed the gospel in the Portsmouth branch of the Southampton Conference, England; emigrated therefrom in April, 1881, with her daughter and son-in-law, B. E. and Mary J. Cooke, with whom she lived up to the time of her death. She died as she had lived, a faithful Latter-day Saint, with a full assurance of a glorious resurrection and exaltation. She was held in high esteem and love by all who had the pleasure of her acquaintance.—COM.

At Littleton, Morgan County, Utah, of heart disease, May 13, 1881, HARRIET PAYNE, wife of Elder Joseph Spendlove. Deceased was born at Medbury, I.
