LOCAL NEWS.

Diphtheria.—Two deaths occurred in one house in the Twenty-first Ward, between Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning, from that dreadful disease, the diphtheria—one the child and the other the grandmother of Mrs. Nowell, a widow lady who lives on South Temple Street. The parents of the latter child only recently came down from their home in Pocatello, Idaho, on a visit, after which the children were stricken with the disease. They were both buried at 8 o'clock last evening.

We learn from Dr. Murphy that Magnus Olsen, of the same ward, also has three children—two girls and a boy—afflicted with this malady, and that the boy's case is very serious.

It is also reported that James Woodward, living in the same vicinity, has the contagion in his family.

As will be seen by a notice published elsewhere, Hazel, the three-year-old daughter of Frank W. and Maggie Kimball Jennings, who has been affected with the diphtheria for a couple of weeks past, out of the Desert Woolen Mills, in Sugar House Ward, succumbed to the disease at 8 o'clock this morning.

Her elder sister was also affected with it, but she has recovered.

Sudden Death.—A telegram from Bishop Lewis, of Logan, received at the Presiding Bishop's office this morning, states that Brother Siels Jensen, of this city, died there last night. No details were given except that the deceased, prior to being buried, expressed the wish to be buried here. Instructions were accordingly sent to have the body prepared and shipped to Salt Lake for burial. The demise of Brother Jensen can only be looked upon as comparatively sudden, as he left here only a few days since, apparently in perfect health, taking with him his family to attend to some work in the Logan Temple. His taking off will surprise and sadden all who knew him. Though filling a humble station in life, he was a man of sterling qualities, and his influence was ever good and wholesome. No better spirited man ever lived, and he was ready for the summons which has called him home. He has acted as a Teacher in the Eighteenth Ward for a number of years, and was always humble and faithful. He was a native of Denmark and is now about above 50 years. Many will remember him as an employee of the Church in the Tithing Yard, where he resided. Peace to the ashes of a truly good man and faithful servant of God.

Police Court.—In the Police Court, this morning, before Judge Speirs, Constant Cook and James Brown were each fined \$5 for drunkenness.

The next case called was that of C. H. M. y Agronome and O. H. Pettit, for fighting. The particulars of the affair, as learned from witnesses, are as follows. On Saturday evening the contestants passed each other on East Temple Street, when Pettit made a remark, asking Agronome how the latter felt. The "cussedness" of Agronome was aroused at the tone of what was said, and he replied, charging Pettit with being partially responsible for the outrage on the residences of Messrs. Dickson, Varnier, and McKay, on the 13th inst. Pettit, aware that he knew of no one more capable of fighting as Agronome, and expressed a belief that he was the guilty party. Agronome then applied a vile epithet to Pettit, and blows followed, the "Gineral" being knocked against a wagon, which prevented his interfering.

Both were taken to the City Jail, where they were released on \$10 bail to appear this morning for trial.

Agronome failed to come, and after waiting an hour, the Court declared the "Gineral" being knocked against a wagon, which prevented his interfering.

Pettit was on hand, and claimed to have acted in self-defense, and there being no evidence to the contrary, he was discharged.

THE HOPT CASE.

The fourth trial of Fred Hopt, for the murder of John P. Turner, which was set for this morning in the District Court, has awakened a strong feeling of interest in the community. A large number of spectators were present in the court room at the opening hour, to witness the proceedings. After the examination of the petit jurors for the September term, the prisoner was brought into court. He was evidently making an attempt to suppress his anxiety, but a feeling of nervousness was plainly manifest.

When the case was taken up, the list of witnesses for the prosecution was called, but only three of the number answered to their names. Mr. Varnier asked that an attachment issue for the absentees, and the Court so ordered, and took recess till two o'clock this afternoon. Some of the witnesses in the Territory reside at a distance from this city, while others are in Colorado and Wyoming, and are expected to arrive here this evening.

John F. Turner, for whose murder Hopt is to be tried, was the son of Sheriff Hopt, of Provo, Utah. On the 20th of June, 1880, young Turner arrived in Park City, looking for work. He had with him two teams, and made his camp on the edge of town. Here he met Hopt, or Welcome, as he was then called. Welcome was known as a "hard citizen," and had several times been in the custody of Sheriff Turner for various offenses. He had been heard to threaten vengeance on the sheriff, but nothing was thought of it. By some means Hopt ingratiated himself into young Turner's good graces, and shared the latter's hospitality.

From the fact that the murder was committed on the evening of July 31, 1880. The blow which deprived the murdered man of his life was evidently given from behind, while the victim was in a stooping posture, with an axe—crushing in the skull above the left ear, and breaking the lower jaw. The murderer had then stuffed the body into one of the wagons, under some chopped barley, where it was permitted to remain for five days. Early on the morning of July 6th, Hopt, in company with Jack Emerson—or McCormick—left Park City, going via Washpish, Coalville and Echo City, into Echo Cañon, on their way to Colorado. Their camp in the cañon was about seven miles above Echo City.

From Echo Cañon, they went to Piedmont, Wyoming, where Hopt sold one of the teams at a low price. They then continued to Green River, where the other team was sold, and Hopt and Emerson parted company.

On the 10th of July, some men discovered, at the place where Hopt and Emerson had camped in Echo Cañon, the body of a young man. It was wrapped in a tent, and had been thrown behind a large boulder, about three rods from the main road, and several rocks had been placed on it. The body, when found, was in an advanced state of decomposition, and the face was unrecognizable, but the condition of the skull showed that a full murder had been committed.

On the 12th a coroner's inquest was held, but no clue could be found as to who the deceased was, or who was the murderer. A description of the body was published in the News, and on reading it, Sheriff Turner recognized the murdered man as his son.

The next day he received a telegram from a gentleman in Park City, stating that he, the sheriff's, team had been sold at Piedmont by Fred Welcome, whom the gentleman had recognized.

The Sheriff immediately started for Echo City, and his son's body was discovered and sent to Provo. Sheriff Turner, with one deputy, went in pursuit of the murderer. His courage and ability as an officer were so well known that the newspapers predicted that if the criminal was above ground he would be captured. Hopt was arrested at Cheyenne, Wyoming, and on July 26th was brought to this city.

Where he was examined, and was held to await the action of the grand jury, which body indicted him for murder in the first degree. When arrested, Hopt made a partial confession of the deed, and charged the crime on his companion, Jack Emerson. He stated that Emerson had done the killing with a board, and they had taken the body to Echo Cañon. Sheriff Turner, on the 28th of July, started to find Emerson, and the latter having learned that he was wanted for the crime, sent word that he could be found at Carbon, Wyoming, where he was arrested.

He was brought to this city disclaiming all knowledge of the deed, and denied ever having seen young Turner in his life. He further stated that he had not joined Hopt until the evening of July 31st, having been "on a spree" in Park City on the 4th, and said that when they went into camp in Echo Cañon he felt sick from the effect of drinking, and went to bed, and that Hopt was absent from camp for about three hours, presumably engaged in removing and hiding the body. Emerson and Hopt subsequently quarreled, and the former went to Carbon, where he was arrested.

When the two were placed in the penitentiary together, Emerson accused Hopt of having got him into the scrape, when he knew he was innocent, and Hopt was so violent in his threats to kill Emerson, that the Warden found it necessary to place Hopt alone in a cell. Emerson was afterwards tried as an accomplice, and being found guilty, was sentenced to imprisonment in the penitentiary, where he is now serving his term.

Hopt was also tried for murder in the first degree, and found guilty. An appeal and a new trial was granted. A second and a third time he was tried, found guilty and sentenced to death, most of the circumstances still being fresh in the public mind. A fourth time a new trial was granted, and it is to be hoped that on this occasion justice will be done, and an end put to the proceedings of the court.

Throughout the entire history of the case Sheriff Turner has shown commendable fortitude and manliness. He has not, on any occasion, notwithstanding the fact that his own son was the victim of a brutal murder, manifested a desire to take the law into his own hands, or to wreak vengeance on the accused, but has awaited a vindication of the law in the courts.

Three times he has passed through the terrible ordeal of the trial, and now, by the errors of the court, he is compelled to face the fourth, and have the harrowing scenes of five years ago recalled.

This afternoon the work of obtaining a jury was proceeded with, and will probably not be concluded today, as at half-past three o'clock only four of the panel had been called.

BEAR RIVER VALLEY.

BREACH OF FAITH ON THE PART OF THE U. P. RAILWAY OR ITS AGENTS. LANDS OCCUPIED BY CITIZENS OF WOODRUFF GOBLED UP BY EVANSTON "CATTLE KINGS."

From a citizen of Woodruff, Bear Lake County, who is in town, we learn that splendid crops have been harvested this year in the settlements in Bear River Valley. No frost has occurred there yet to injure the growing vegetation, and not only is the grain much better than usual, but a much larger acreage than ever before has been raised. The hay crop has also been correspondingly good, and the feed on the range excellent, so that stock have done unusually well.

The citizens of Woodruff have lately been the victims of misplaced confidence, and as a result, lost a great share of their best hay land. Part of the land heretofore occupied by them comes within the limits of the U. P. Railway land subsidy. So far as the people were able to secure the titles to the land they occupied from the government, they have done so, and they long since made application to the U. P. agent in Omaha, who had charge of the selling of its lands, to purchase that portion of their claims which fell within the railway sections. They were informed by him that their applications were filed, that they could go on making improvements, and whenever the time came for the land to be sold they should be notified and have the first chance to purchase. In the meantime they were required to pay a yearly rental of 25 cents per acre, and many of the settlers have continued to do so for the past ten years.

A good many non-"Mormons," however, who occupied land in the valley not only refused to pay the rent required, but were allowed to hold their claims without doing so. Instead of the people being notified according to promise, when the land could be purchased the only notice given was through an obscure paper, the *Evansville Age*, and that was to the effect that purchasers of large quantities were wanted. Individually the citizens of Woodruff were not able to buy townships, but they were both able and anxious to purchase smaller subdivisions of land, and on learning of the obscure advertisement, which they did almost accidentally, as there was but one copy of the paper subscribed for in the settlement, they made application to the resident agent of the railway company at Evanston for the privilege of purchasing the land they occupied in quantities to suit their circumstances, and he led them to suppose that they would be allowed to do so.
