IT WON'T COME IMMEDIATELY.

Colonial Preference Dead Issue Part—Annexation Must Issue In Canada.

New York, Sept. 21.—In discussing the political condition prevalent in Great Britain, Sir Gilbert Parker, member of parliament, who is now in this city, said last night that the most important question is Joseph Chamberlain's policy of preferential tariff.

"We have taken a small leaf out of a large American book," he went on. "I hardly think the question will be settled at the next election. Just as it would be impossible to convert the United States to free trade in three years, so I do not anticipate it will be possible to convert Great Britain to the policy of reciprocity and tariff reform in this same space of time."

This will not affect the relations between England and England. Any preference we may give Canada will be recognized by all good Americans as perfectly legitimate.
