New York, March 14 .- J. Alden Loring, curator of mammals in Bronx park, left today for Kodiak island and the Cook's Inlet country. Mr. Loring goes to the far north as the field agent of the New York Zoological society, with instructions to capture and send back here specimens of the Kodiak bear and white sheep, neither of which animals is in captivity at present. Inci-dentally, Mr. Loring is directed to secure specimens of moose, caribou, deer, brown bears and any other animais which should stray across his path.
